

Dear Mr. Caton:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206 (1992), on behalf of MFS Network Technologies, Inc. ("MFS"), we hereby advise the Commission of the meetings held with the senior staff of Commissioner Duggan's office and the Commission staff of the Private Radio Bureau on November 22, 1993. In those meetings, we discussed the MFS Network Technologies/Texas Instruments, Incorporated position regarding the Commission's proposal to adopt permanent automatic vehicle monitoring ("AVM") rules for the 902-928 MHz band, the specific allocation of frequencies between wide area pulse-ranging and local area tag/reader systems within that allocation, and the extent to which low power radio frequency devices operating pursuant to Part 15 of the Commission's Rules can co-exist with AVM systems.
