

Dear Mr. Caton:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206 (1992), on behalf of MFS Network Technologies, Inc. and Texas Instruments Incorporated ("MFS/TI"), we hereby advise the Commission of the MFS/TI meetings held with the Commission staff of the Private Radio Bureau on November 18, 1993. In those meetings, we discussed MFS/TI's position regarding the Commission's proposal to adopt permanent automatic vehicle monitoring ("AVM") rules for the 902-928 MHz band, and the specific allocation of frequencies between wide-area pulse ranging and local-area tag/reader systems within that allocation, and the extent to which low power radio frequency devices operating pursuant to Part 15 of the Commission's Rules can co-exist with the AVM systems.
