To The Commission:

1. I am opposed to PR Docket 93-267 because it is not in the best interests of Amateur Radio.
2. Though I have only been an amateur since April 1992, I have listened, observed and operated and feel qualified to comment. I operate on 6 and 2 meter FM and Packet. I am a member of the Carroll Country Amateur Radio Club.
3. As an active Amateur Radio operator, I am concerned that instant licensing may encourage operation by unlicensed persons with self assigned callsigns. The Commission will not be able to identify the source of TVI, RFI and intentional interference as they can with someone who is using a Federal Communications Commission assigned callsign. Electronic filing as described in Public Law 102-538 is a much better solution to speeding up the licensing time. Electronic filing would be worth waiting for as the Commission would maintain control of the issue of callsigns and ensure the callsigns that are issued conform to ITU regulations.
4. I fully support the American Radio Relay League position on PR Docket 93-267.

To The Commission:

1. I am opposed to PR Docket 93-267 because it is not in the best interests of Amateur Radio and not in the best interests of the Enforcement Divisions of the Federal Communications Commission.
2. First licensed as a Novice class licensee WN3TZZ in 1/73 and upgraded to Extra class Licensee in 1/76 and issued N3UN in 5/77. I am an active operator on HF and VHF, CW, Packet, SSB, RTTY and FM. I am a member of the Capitol Hill Amateur Radio Society, the Carroll Country Amateur Radio Club, the National Capitol DX Association, the Potomac Valley Radio Club and the Potomac Valley DX Spotting Network.
3. As an active Amateur Radio operator, I am concerned that instant licensing may encourage unlicensed persons to operate. The Commission will be unable to easily identify the source of TVI and RFI if caused by an unlicensed person operating with a self assigned callsign. A better system, though not immediately available is "electronic filing" as addressed in Public Law 102-538. This would be worth waiting for as the Commission would maintain control of the issue of callsigns and limit the callsigns that conform to ITU regulations.
4. I support the American Radio Relay League position on PR Docket 93-267.
