Heck, I would have been happy with a five-way tie in the presidential election so that I could go on working with all of you.


But, since that didn't happen, the least I can do is tell you how much your support, enthusiasm and wisdom has meant to OAPB in general, and to me in particular.


Dear Mr. Williamson,




Dear Dave:


