

1 1 was rejected.)

2 JUDGE CHACHKIN: And if the review board or the  
3 Commission, on reviewing this case, feels that this material  
4 directly should have been allowed in then we'll have the  
5 benefit of the cross examination.

6 MR. HONIG: Now S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 2 is the  
7 deposition of Andrew Cherry. Now portions of his declaration,  
8 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 13, were admitted so we would offer his,  
9 his deposition.

10 MR. MULLIN: No objection.

11 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 2 is  
12 received.

13 (The document previously marked for  
14 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
15 2 was entered into evidence.)

16 MR. HONIG: Now S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 3 is the  
17 deposition testimony of Charles Cherry, his declaration,  
18 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 14, was rejected, so in light of Your  
19 Honor's previous ruling I, I'm assuming you're rejecting  
20 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 3?

21 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Correct, the exhibit will be  
22 rejected --

23 MR. HONIG: So --

24 JUDGE CHACHKIN: -- but that'll go along as part of  
25 the offer of proof, yes.

1 (The document previously marked for  
2 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
3 3 was rejected.)

4 MR. HONIG: Uh-huh. S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 4 is the  
5 deposition testimony of Sherwood DuBois, DuBois' declaration,  
6 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 15 was rejected, and S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 4  
7 then I take it is also rejected, is that, that's correct?

8 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 4 is rejected.  
9 (The document previously marked for  
10 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
11 4 was rejected.)

12 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 5 is the deposition  
13 testimony of Professor Donald Jones, his declaration,  
14 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 16 has been rejected.

15 MR. MULLIN: Was that all rejected?

16 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

17 MR. HONIG: So I believe then Your Honor will be  
18 rejecting S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 5?

19 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Correct, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 5 is  
20 rejected.

21 (The document previously marked for  
22 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
23 5 was rejected.)

24 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 6 is the deposition  
25 testimony of Johnny McMillion, her declaration, S.A.L.A.D.

1 Exhibit 17, was rejected, and I presume Your Honor is  
2 rejecting S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 6?

3 JUDGE CHACHKIN: That's correct, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
4 6 was rejected.

5 (The document previously marked for  
6 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
7 6 was rejected.)

8 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 7 is the deposition  
9 testimony of Carlton Moore, portions of his declaration,  
10 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 18, were accepted, and I would then move  
11 the acceptance of S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 7.

12 MR. MULLIN: No objection.

13 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 7 is received.  
14 (The document previously marked for  
15 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
16 7 was entered into evidence.)

17 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 8 is the deposition  
18 of Kathleen Shea, Dr. Shea's declaration, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
19 19 was rejected and then I'm assuming S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 9  
20 -- 8, I'm sorry, is also being rejected?

21 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 8 is rejected.  
22 (The document previously marked for  
23 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
24 8 was rejected.)

25 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 9 is the deposition

1 testimony of Osvaldo Soto, his declaration, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
2 20 has been rejected.

3 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 9 is also  
4 rejected.

5 (The document previously marked for  
6 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
7 9 was rejected.)

8 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 10 is the deposition  
9 testimony of Rodney Thaxton, his declaration, S.A.L.A.D.  
10 Exhibit 21, was rejected.

11 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 10 is also  
12 rejected.

13 (The document previously marked for  
14 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
15 10 was rejected.)

16 MR. HONIG: And S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 11 is the  
17 deposition testimony of William Thompson, whose declaration,  
18 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 22, was rejected.

19 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 11 is rejected.

20 (The document previously marked for  
21 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
22 11 was rejected.)

23 MR. HONIG: Turning then to S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 23,  
24 that is the biographical sketch of Bradford Brown whose  
25 declaration and deposition testimony was rejected. I'm

1 assuming that S.A.L.A.D. 23 was then also rejected?

2 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 23 is rejected.

3 (The document previously marked for  
4 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
5 23 was rejected.)

6 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 24 is the vitae of  
7 Dr. Andrew Cherry, his, portions of his declaration,  
8 S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 13 were admitted and his deposition  
9 testimony was admitted, and I would offer S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
10 24 which describes his credentials.

11 MR. MULLIN: I object to that, it was not timely  
12 exchanged. This particular document was provided at the time  
13 of the deposition, there were no questions about it. I  
14 believe he is identified in material you have received as a  
15 professor of social work research; the exhibit is untimely.  
16 Objection on that ground.

17 MR. HONIG: Your Honor, I believe at the exchange  
18 date we were required only to provide testimony. There was no  
19 request if I recall correctly in document production for this  
20 document so consequently it was offered as part of the direct  
21 case and as Counsel has correctly stated it was provided at  
22 the time of the witness's deposition. So there was an  
23 opportunity to examine him on it.

24 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 24  
25 will be received.

1 (The document previously marked for  
2 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
3 24 was entered into evidence.)

4 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 25 is Charles W.  
5 Cherry's resume, his testimony was rejected, I'm assuming then  
6 your intention is to reject S.A.L.A.D. number 25?

7 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 25 is rejected.  
8 (The document previously marked for  
9 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
10 25 was rejected.)

11 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. number 26 is Rodney Thaxton's  
12 resume, his testimony was rejected and I'm presuming Your  
13 Honor is going to reject S.A.L.A.D. 26?

14 JUDGE CHACHKIN: I assume there's an objection to  
15 these, Mr. Mullin, I didn't ask you --

16 MR. MULLIN: Sir?

17 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Did you object to 25?

18 MR. MULLIN: Yes, I object to 25. The deposition,  
19 the declaration was not accepted, was it?

20 JUDGE CHACHKIN: No, that's correct.

21 MR. MULLIN: Well then, yes --

22 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right, 26 --

23 MR. MULLIN: 25, 26 and 27, the declaration  
24 testimony of those people was not received, was it?

25 MR. HONIG: On 27 part if it was received.

1 MR. MULLIN: All right, then --

2 MR. HONIG: Carlton --

3 MR. MULLIN: All right, then 27 should go in. I  
4 object to it as untimely but you've ruled on that.

5 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes. All right, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
6 26 is rejected, S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 27 is received.

7 (The document previously marked for  
8 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
9 26 was rejected.)

10 (The document previously marked for  
11 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
12 27 was entered into evidence.)

13 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 28 --

14 MR. MULLIN: I won't object to 28, it's necessary  
15 for the deposition of Dr. Andrew Cherry, which has been  
16 received.

17 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 28 is received.

18 (The document previously marked for  
19 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
20 28 was entered into evidence.)

21 MR. HONIG: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 29 is offered.

22 MR. MULLIN: Now help me, I've forgotten whether,  
23 did Carlton Moore go in in part?

24 MR. HONIG: Carlton Moore went in in part, and  
25 Andrew Cherry went in in part.

1 MR. MULLIN: Just, may I have just a moment?

2 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

3 MR. MULLIN: This may be relevant, I don't want to  
4 keep it out if it's relevant.

5 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

6 MR. MULLIN: Now I've forgotten. Carlton Moore, and  
7 Carlton Moore's deposition is in is it not?

8 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

9 MR. MULLIN: Give me another moment on that please.  
10 I'm sorry, at the moment I'm doing a blank as to whether he  
11 testified about crime or not. Let me --

12 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Well let me indicate that whether  
13 or not he testified, the question is, is not necessarily  
14 determinative of whether I will allow an illustrative program  
15 --

16 MR. MULLIN: I understand.

17 JUDGE CHACHKIN: If the absence of evidence  
18 indicating that this breakdown that was made is, is, was not  
19 prepared properly, if all this is an analysis of the station's  
20 own issue program list I'm inclined to receive it. We don't  
21 need any sponsoring witnesses, it can stand on its own, and  
22 particularly if this deals with the topics which the station  
23 itself, determining that, in it's ascertainment -- If this is  
24 merely an attempt to break it down under each of these topics  
25 I would receive that --

1 MR. MULLIN: We're at 29?

2 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

3 MR. MULLIN: I don't think 29 is relevant to  
4 anything that's been received.

5 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Well as I indicated I'm going to  
6 receive it --

7 MR. MULLIN: Okay.

8 JUDGE CHACHKIN: It merely is a breakdown, an  
9 analysis of the station's own issue responsiveness list --

10 MR. MULLIN: All right. I think that ruling then  
11 would cover 28 through 34.

12 JUDGE CHACHKIN: That's correct.

13 MR. MULLIN: All right. That makes it simpler.

14 MR. HONIG: If that is so, Your Honor, and, and 30,  
15 31 and 32 is the forum, 33 and 34 are offered and I understand  
16 then they're being received?

17 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

18 MR. MULLIN: Okay.

19 JUDGE CHACHKIN: S.A.L.A.D. Exhibits 29 through 34  
20 are being received, yes.

21 (The documents previously marked for  
22 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibits  
23 29 - 34 were entered into evidence.)

24 MR. HONIG: Then that completes S.A.L.A.D.'s case.

25 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right.

1 MR. MULLIN: Can we go off the record, Your Honor?

2 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

3 (Off the record.)

4 (Back on the record.)

5 MR. HONIG: I understand that we've taken  
6 S.A.L.A.D.'s exhibits out of sequence and I wanted to thank  
7 Trinity's counsel for his graciousness in allowing us to do  
8 that.

9 MR. MULLIN: I appreciate it also because it's  
10 accommodated me on what maybe plans of mine, what I can  
11 salvage from them.

12 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes, we'll go back off the record.

13 (Off the record.)

14 (Back on the record.)

15 JUDGE CHACHKIN: Back on the record. I note that I  
16 rejected the declaration of Mr. McMillion. Mr. Honig is not  
17 here, I guess Mr. Mullin is not here, but I've had second  
18 thoughts about one paragraph, and you can put in the cross  
19 examination if you wish. But I indicate, I did accept, after  
20 I rejected this exhibit I did accept other material dealing  
21 with coverage of an organization, and --

22 MR. MCCURDY: Which exhibit number was that?

23 JUDGE CHACHKIN: We're talking about number 17, the  
24 President of the NAACP, the Miami-Dade branch of the NAACP.  
25 And I'm talking about paragraph two. And paragraph three.

1 You see paragraphs two and three?

2 MR. MCCURDY: Yes, sir.

3 JUDGE CHACHKIN: And I think it's my intention to  
4 receive those portions of S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 17 which I  
5 previously indicated I'm rejecting, so I assume you want the  
6 cross examination to come in?

7 MR. MCCURDY: I would assume so, Your Honor, but I  
8 think I might like to take an opportunity to --

9 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right.

10 MR. MCCURDY: -- while the other proceedings are  
11 moving forward to look at that cross examination and let you  
12 know.

13 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right, but S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
14 17, those portions of S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 17 -- well, I should  
15 say paragraphs one, two and three of S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit 17  
16 are, is received.

17 (The document previously marked for  
18 identification as S.A.L.A.D. Exhibit  
19 17 was entered into evidence,  
20 modified as stated.)

21 JUDGE CHACHKIN: I was inconsistent as it was  
22 indicated previously that the cross examination also come in,  
23 but I'll wait and see. That's the only change I want to make.

24 As far as I know that's the only, of the exhibits I  
25 rejected that is the only area, instance of the ones I

1 | rejected where there was a request to cover the station, or  
2 | there was an attempt to have a dialogue with the station. If  
3 | there are others you can tell me the ones that are rejected,  
4 | but I, perhaps --

5 |           MR. EMMONS: Limited to an organization?

6 |           JUDGE CHACHKIN: Limited to an organization, yes.

7 |           MR. MCCURDY: Right.

8 |           JUDGE CHACHKIN: Of some significance in this case,  
9 | as the NAACP. If there are other, any other instances that I  
10 | overlooked you can call it to my attention and I'll look at it  
11 | --

12 |           MR. MCCURDY: Okay.

13 |           JUDGE CHACHKIN: Because I didn't mean to reject  
14 | that, those portions.

15 |           All right, I'm reserving this time the question of  
16 | receiving or rejecting the deposition of Ms. McMillion until  
17 | counsel has an opportunity to look at it.

18 |           All right, let's proceed. The next exhibits?

19 |           MR. SHOOK: Your Honor, the next exhibits would be  
20 | the exhibits of the Mass Media Bureau. Before I proceed I  
21 | would ask your indulgence for one minute off the record to  
22 | discuss a matter with Mr. Topel and Mr. Cohen?

23 |           JUDGE CHACHKIN: Yes.

24 |           (Off the record.)

25 |           (Back on the record.)

1 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right, back on the record. How  
2 are we going to proceed?

3 MR. SHOOK: Your Honor, we would like to proceed  
4 volume by volume in terms of marking for identification Bureau  
5 Exhibits numbers 1 through 413.

6 JUDGE CHACHKIN: All right.

7 MR. SHOOK: Your Honor, we have given the court  
8 reporter two copies of our volume one, our volume one contains  
9 Exhibits numbered 1 through 63, which I will now ask that they  
10 be marked for identification.
