Report on WTGI TV-61 Wilmington, DE.

As a part of this report, I am including pictures of weak reception of WTGI. For the most part, these pictures represent the boundaries that I feel would delineate between good reliable reception and marginal reception. At the time these pictures were taken, the transmitter was operating at half power. No allowance was made for this reduced power--I am only showing what I saw. For each photo I have shown an approximate distance from the transmitter, the approximate direction from the transmitter, and some additional comments. Reception nearer the transmitter was better, as you would expect. Pictures were not taken of the good reception since they would have only been what would be considered good reception. One exception is that Downtown Philadelphia has problems with multipath as is normally found with UHF television in the vicinity of High-Rise Buildings.

Channel 61, as shown to me, is a two-part facility. The transmitter building and tower are located on a large acreage (on which they owe back taxes). There is not a proper well for drinking water nor is there sewer (not even a septic system) at the transmitter site. Presently the Master Control position is located directly in front of the transmitter along with an automation system for rolling in commercials and automated logging. The concrete block transmitter building was apparently added onto an existing building which originally had four tall garage doors on one side and other entrances. Comfort facilities for Master Control operators are provided by having a mobile home type of trailer parked inside the original building. Water for the toilet is supplied from a "surface" well and bottled water is provided for drinking water. There is a large holding tank underneath the trailer for waste, and this needs to be pumped periodically. There is also a limited kitchen facility inside the trailer. The original building has walls being built in it presently to divide the space into several rooms which will be for Master Control, a kitchen, rest room, etc. I was told that they cannot drill a well or install a septic system (or do any construction presently) because of the unpaid back taxes. I believe this could turn into a very good Transmitter and Master control facility with studio and offices to be added somewhere at a later date.

The studio facility has been newly relocated to the east side of Philadelphia near the Delaware River from the original location in Wilmington, DE. I understand that they were behind on the rent in Wilmington and the landlord wanted them gone. The new facility became available at about half the price of the rent they were paying in Wilmington and the owner of the building in Philadelphia worked with them in remodeling the eighth (and top) floor of his building according to their designs and desires. He even supplied a lot of the custom cabinetry, etc that they wanted. This studio facility occupies 12,500 sq. ft. in the "River-view Place" building. Channel 61 leases this space for \$9.50/sq.

ft. with a five-year lease. The lease also has a five-year renewal clause.

Even though this is to be the Studio and Headquarters for Channel 61, they don't even watch the station anywhere that I could see, and a direct microwave path to the transmitter from the studio is virtually impossible. To connect to the transmitter site via microwave would require a double-hop, which turns out to be very expensive. The only real suggestion of the TV station is that the traffic department and sales offices are there.

The studio facility is very promising and could turn out to be a good audio and video production facility, but it seems to be strangely remote and un-connected with the transmitter and Master Control. Therefore, I feel we should be able to relieve them of Channel 61 (Transmitter, Master Control, and the License), they can then pay off their debts, and go ahead with their Production Facility. At an appropriate later date, TBN could build their own studio and office facility at whatever location would be appropriate, as has been done before.

WTGI also owns a Vertex 6.1 meter satellite dish which is not assembled (no construction permitted at transmitter). Presently they are using a consumer (mesh) dish to receive satellite.

WTGI has also rented tower space on the channel 61 tower for a microwave feed-thru. I didn't learn who the client is, but they have a small building at the base of the tower to house that equipment.

The Comark 110 kw transmitter seems to be in good condition. I wasn't able to thoroughly go over it and it could have problems I wasn't aware of, but according to the monitors, the waveform looked good and the audio sounded good. The video waveform wasn't quite correct when we arrived at the transmitter, so the chief engineer adjusted it and explained to the new master control operator what he had done and why. The transmitter has two pulsers for the visual klystrons but they are not in operation and never have been. I didn't find out why they were never in service. I suspect there was a technical problem with them that was never resolved. The transmitter has two cooling systems--one for one visual and the aural, the other for the second visual amplifier. Also, there are two high-voltage power supplies--one for one visual and the aural, the other for the second visual amplifier. The diplexer is waveguide-type and has "magic-tee" automatic switchovers which makes half-power operation with only one visual possible with a minimum of effort, as well as other advantages. There is surge protection through a 600 amp LEA surge protector. They also have a voltage regulator which has failed and been repaired a few times. (The side was off the voltage regulator cabinet because it had been just recently repaired.)

Previously, when they were in Wilmington, DE with the studio at their original location, Master Control was at the studio and office site and the transmitter was operated by remote control via microwave. Consequently, they have both ends of a Harris/Farion redundant hot-standby microwave system which is not presently being used. They also have Mosely telemetry. I didn't find out what type of remote control system they have.

The tower was manufactured by Stainless and as far as I could tell, there have been no problems with the tower. The tower lighting is a Flash Technology strobe system. (3 tiers and top beacon). The lights are a typical Flash Technology system with the typical problems and need for up-keep that their systems require. There is a 440 volt emergency stand-by generator for the tower lights. The problem is that The lights require 480 volts for proper operation, so when on the generator, the lights "twinkle" and do not operate properly and reliably. The tower probably has a 7 or 7 1/2 foot face--I'm guessing, but it looks substantial. Tower height is 974 feet. Transmission line is waveguide.

The Bank of California, N.A. ("Bank") is pleased to make available to National Minority TV, Inc. ("Borrower") the following line of credit the basic terms and conditions of which are described in this letter.

1. LINE OF CREDIT

- a. Amount. A line of credit in the maximum principal amount of Three Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,600,000.00).
- b. Term. The final maturity date of all obligations of Borrower under the Line of Credit is 9/30/91 ("Termination Date").
- c. Purpose. All advances under the Line of Credit ("Advances") shall be used solely for the purchase of WTGI - TV, Channel 61 Wilmington Delaware.

2. INTEREST, PRICING AND FEES

- a. Interest. The outstanding principal balance of all Advances under the line of Credit shall bear interest at Bank's Prime Rate. The Prime Rate is a fluctuating rate from time to time set by Bank which is based on various factors, including general economic and market conditions, and is used as a reference point for pricing certain loans. Bank may price its loans at, above or below the prime Rate. Each change in the rate of interest shall become effective on the date each Prime Rate change is announced within the Bank.
- b. Interest Calculation and Penalty Rate. Interest on and fees for each Facility are calculated for actual days elapsed on the basis of a 360-day year, which results in

higher payments than if a 365-day year were used. All sums not paid upon their respective maturities shall bear interest at a rate per annum equal to the Prime Rate plus 5%, until paid in full, whether before or after judgment. In no event shall Borrower be obligated to pay interest at a rate in excess of the highest rate permitted by applicable law from time to time in effect.

c. Repayment. Borrower may repay and reborrow Advances under the Line of Credit in accordance with the terms of the Loan Documents. Interest shall be payable monthly on the Facility as further set forth in the Loan Documents. All payments are to be made to Bank's Garden Grove office or such other place(s) Bank may designate in writing. All Advances and amounts due under the Revolving Credit must be paid no later than the Termination Date.

### 3. SECURITY AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION

a. Security. As security for all obligations of the Borrower under the Line of Credit cash will be pledged in the amount of \$3,600,000.00 in a depository account with The Bank of California from a source acceptable to Bank.

b. Other Necessary Loan Documentation. Borrower confirms that, prior to the Closing Date, it and any necessary third party will execute or cause to be executed the Loan Documents, and will provide such opinions of counsel covering such matters as Bank may require. Further, prior to the Closing Date, Borrower will provide or cause to be provided to Bank authorization documentation (including borrowing resolutions or authorizations and certificates of incumbency) confirming to Bank that all necessary organizational actions have been taken to allow Borrower to incur the indebtedness represented by the Facility and to grant any security interests therefor, and confirming that those executing Loan Documents on behalf of Borrower or third parties are duly authorized.

### 4. CONDITIONS PRECEDENT

Funding of the Line of Credit is subject to the following:

a. Loan Documents. All Loan Documents shall be in form and substance satisfactory to Bank.

b. No Material Adverse Change. No material adverse change shall have occurred to Borrower, its business, or to any guarantor, since the date of the last financial statements that Borrower or guarantor, as the case may be, has delivered to Bank for review.

5. COVENANTS AND OTHER TERMS

a. Other Loan Document Conditions to Funding. In addition to those which may be set forth herein, the Loan Documents shall contain further representations and warranties, affirmative and negative covenants, conditions precedent to funding, a dispute resolution requirement, and other standard provisions customary for credits of this type and amount. Further, the Loan Documents shall include events of default which will give Bank certain rights and remedies, in addition to terminating the Facility, should Borrower fail to perform in accordance with its agreements.

b. Reimbursement. Borrower will reimburse Bank upon demand for all out-of-pocket costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees for the negotiation and preparation of the Loan Documents, the costs of security interest perfection, including documentation, recording, filing, and audit and appraisal fees, [title insurance premiums, inspection fees, and brokerage fees and commissions], regardless of whether the Facility(ies) is/are finally documented and funded, and all costs of collection, including all attorneys' fees, all as more fully described in the Loan Documents.

c. Order of Superiority of Documents. This letter supersedes all prior discussions and negotiations about the Facility(ies) which Bank and Borrower have had. Once the Loan Documents are executed, this letter shall be automatically superseded and canceled.

6. GOVERNING LAW Except as may be otherwise expressly stated therein, all Loan Documents will be governed by the laws of the State of California.

IF BORROWER AND BANK ARE UNABLE TO AGREE ON ANY REMAINING REQUIRED COVENANTS AND TERMS, OR IF THE CONDITIONS PRECEDENT STATED IN THIS LETTER DO NOT OCCUR OR ARE NOT SATISFIED, NEITHER THIS LETTER NOR ANY OTHER DEALINGS BETWEEN BORROWER AND BANK SHALL BE CONSTRUED AS A LEGALLY BINDING CONTRACT OF ANY KIND, OTHER THAN BORROWER'S PROMISE TO PAY BANK CERTAIN FEES UNDER SECTION 5 (b) HEREOF.

Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this letter, including any alleged torts, shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with Title 9 of the U.S. Code and the Commercial Arbitration rules of the American Arbitration Association. Judgment upon the award rendered may be entered in any court having jurisdiction.

This commitment by Bank is personal to Borrower and may not be transferred or assigned to, or relied upon by, any other


