Those present discussed the desirability of using a letter of credit to provide funding for Community Brace, Inc. and the requirement of the corporation bank, First Interstate, or a resolution in accord with their approved forms.

The following resolution was then adopted:

Resolved, that any of the following acting alone: Paul F. Crouch, President, or Jane Duff, Secretary, of this corporation are hereby authorized, from time to time, in the name of this corporation to secure letters of credit or to obtain credit, with or without security, separately or jointly, from FIRST INTERSTATE BANK OF CALIFORNIA (hereinafter called the "Bank"), in such sums and upon such terms as may seem advisable to such officers. Said officers are authorized, with or without the corporate seal, to execute notes, drafts, guarantees, subordination agreements, applications and agreements for letters of credit, acceptance agreements, foreign exchange contracts, or other contracts or agreements of any type as evidence thereof or in connection therewith, and to pledge, assign, mortgage or hypothecate and to execute security agreements, financing statements, mortgages and deeds of trust upon or give trust receipts for such property of this corporation as may be agreed upon between them and Bank as security for any obligations of this corporation, now or hereafter existing. Any instruments executed hereunder are to be in such form and contain such terms and conditions as may be required by Bank.

Any one of such officers is authorized from time to time in the name of this corporation to endorse and discount with Bank, notes, drafts, trade acceptances, contracts and other paper at anytime owned or held by this corporation, and to guarantee payment thereof and to authorize and request Bank to purchase, exchange, sell or otherwise deal in or with stocks, bonds and other instruments, securities or property, all on such terms as such officer may approve.

Any one of such officers is also authorized to direct the disposition of the proceeds of any such obligation, and to accept from or direct delivery by Bank of any property of this corporation at any time held by Bank.

The authority given hereunder shall be deemed retroactive and any and all acts authorized hereunder performed prior to the passage of this resolution are hereby approved and ratified. The authority herein conferred shall continue in full force and effect until written notice of its revocation shall be received by Bank at


each office of the Bank in which any account or credit of this corporation may be located.



Dear Jane:

Over the past 11 months, I have been keeping track of all of Trinity's stations (licensed and authorized) which have been mentioned as candidates for major modification during the next LPTV filing window. Enclosed is a list of those facilities, organized by the type of modification required.

The list of New Channel/New Community candidates are comprised of situations whereby we own a Construction Permit or licensed station in a market where we already operate an existing facility or have duplicated affiliate coverage. The list also contains stations in markets with population. In each of these cases, I have suggested a new community to which we could modify the underlying authorization, assuming a suitable channel can be found. [You will notice that in most cases, I have specified the new communities based upon the population-weighted priority list I sent to you September 30, 1992 (which was subsequently modified by George Horvath using his own population program). I chose communities off that list if they were anywhere within the same geographic region as the community we are giving up. As a result, some of the suggested affiliate new filings we talked about a month ago have been re-assigned, as I will discuss later.] After a channel search for the new community is conducted, a site will need to be secured by George Horvath before we can be in a position to file an application.

The Power Increase list contains stations which are operating with less than optimum power (due to minor modification requirements or due to our desire during the last LPTV window not to file the application with a waiver request). The only thing I need to do to activate these filings is to run an interference study on each facility to make sure the power increase we desire meets the FCC's interference requirements.

The Site Change list contains stations for which we want to change sites but could not do so under minor modification constraints. In some cases, we know the new site from which we'd like to operate (although in almost all cases, we don't yet have specific authority to use someone's tower there). In such a circumstance, I need to ensure that site meets

the FCC interference criteria on our presently authorized channel. If it will not work, I need to run a channel search to see if a different channel will fit there. If nothing is available, we must select a new site (presumably specifying the best channel from the previously conducted search). For a situation where we don't have a site to begin with, we can choose to explore all sites in the market and run the interference check (and, if necessary, conduct a channel search) based on the best site found by George. Alternatively, I can first define the area for George within which we must locate a site to remain on-channel and within FCC interference tolerances. Obviously, the latter approach is site-limiting, and I don't recommend it.

The list labeled Antenna or Height Change contains stations which could be improved through an antenna change. Each has been discussed between George or Ben and I at some point during the past year.

The next list is one which I condensed from a list provided to me in August by George. These might be candidates for relocation within the given market, or re-located to a distant market of greater population. In either case, new sites will need to be secured by George.

Last, I have included lists of new filings which could be filed by Trinity affiliates. The lists are derived from the population-ranked priority list mentioned earlier. It is important to note that these are simply suggestions, based upon market size and, to some extent, proximity to existing affiliate stations. You are the only one to which I have made the suggestions. It is up to you and Paul to decide how, or even ~~if~~, to disseminate the information.

As far as Trinity's major modifications are concerned, there are a lot of stations contained in these lists. Please go through them as soon as possible with George and Ben. If you want to conference me into the discussion, all the better. But it is critical that we immediately develop a final list of all stations we plan to modify during the window. The majority are going to require site acquisition, and we need to give George as much lead time as possible to pursue them. In addition, I can begin preliminary work on the applications so that we are not in a crunch when the FCC announces the next window.

As you are probably aware, Colby, Joe, Brian and I are getting very strong rumors (from various sources at the FCC) that an LPTV filing window will be opening at the beginning of March. That leaves less than 60 days to



ANNUAL MEETING OF THE COMBINED BOARD OF DIRECTORS
TRINITY CHRISTIAN CENTER OF SANTA ANA, INC.

Pursuant to written notice duly given, a combined annual meeting of the Board of Directors of Trinity Broadcasting Network, Inc., Trinity Christian Center of Santa Ana, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Arizona, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Denver, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Washington, Trinity Broadcasting of Oklahoma City, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Florida, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Indiana, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Texas, Inc., Trinity Broadcasting of Ciskei, and Trinity Broadcasting of Nevis, Ltd. was held on January 18, 1993 at Tustin, California.

The Secretary noted that a quorum of board members, and where applicable, shareholders for each stock corporation were present and that notice had been duly given to all directors and shareholders as required by the bylaws of the respective corporations. In addition, Paul F. Crouch represented Janice W. Crouch, Charles T. Vlaun and Grace Cephas pursuant to written proxies.

The President reviewed 1992, and anticipated events in 1993, by considering the elements of spiritual warfare. Major changes are underway that promise intense spiritual battles. Many Christian leaders are predicting changes; we have experienced some positive victories such as the recent Cable Act and face other situations that present challenges.

Psalm 18:34, "He teaches my hands to war," was read. We need to know how to engage in spiritual battle and who the real enemy is. Heretic hunters waste their time attempting to prove errors in doctrines held by fellow believers. This is particularly true with respect to the manifestation of God's power today. We need to fight the deceiver and to focus our energies in unity on the real enemy.

The first step is to realize we battle against "enemies" in high places. Evil spirits should be our target. The key for the Body of Christ is to know that our spiritual enemy is organized.

We, as a Body of Christ, must unite and organize to bring back the rule of the King of Kings.

Revelation 1:12 and 2:11 refer to the "Sword" that issues from the mouth of the Lord. It is a sharp two-edged sword. In Ephesians 6:10, we are informed of the details of spiritual warfare. We are commanded to take the sword of the Spirit, "which is the Word of God."

That sword comes forth from our mouth as we speak God's truth.

In the opening chapters of Genesis, we continually read, "God said...." Words are powerful. It is imperative that we speak out loud. Jesus came to destroy "the works" of the devil. We may bind his works, but we do not bind the devil.

The opposition of the evil one is demonstrated in practical ways. For example, the construction supervisor of our International Production Center recently reported that in his entire career, he has never witnessed a project that faced so many difficulties. This illustrates how important this project is and how important it is for us to remain alert and to unleash the sword of the Spirit.

The sword is ineffective unless we take it out of its sheath. To insure the completion of the International Production Center, a prayer march around the construction site is planned next week. In addition, we will ask our partners to raise the sword of the Spirit against the evil one.

Those present joined in united prayer.

The President proceeded to provide a brief report on 1992.

In 1992, we averaged approximately one new station on the air each week. More than 333 stations are on the air. Now, there is a promise of new stations in Moscow and China.

Affiliated low power stations have just come on the air in Alabama, including Huntsville, Dothan, Decatur, Tuscaloosa and Selma. In addition, a low power station is on the air in Tampa, Florida.

In 1990, the combined gross income was \$69,377,350; 1991 combined gross income was \$80,166,612 and estimated gross income for 1992 is in excess of \$80,000,000.

The 1991 financial statement for Trinity and its affiliates was approved with a statement of praise and thanksgiving.

It was moved, seconded and passed that we approve the audited financial reports.

Each station then reported.

Bob Higley from Bloomington, Indiana reported that the station's F.C.C. renewal was granted for five years. The station was recently visited by Bill Allison, Trinity's F.C.C. compliance inspector and was found to be in compliance.

Cross-training of production and master control employees is occurring. This is primarily with week-end staff.

Terrell Smith of New York reported that several ministers in the area had prayed and fasted for the station. A new antenna has been acquired.

Mike Everett from Florida reported that Channel 45 had survived Hurricane Andrew. It was off the air for one day due to a lack of power, but there was no physical damage. In January, a major cable system of 30,000 subscribers put the station on the air.

Billie Watts reported that this was her first year at the Arizona station. The year has been one of challenges. Satanist, Anton Lavey and his supporters pray daily to destroy local ministers.

Overtime has been cut-out and cross-training is occurring.

The President reported that stations are now required to report the number of payroll hours that are incurred to the accounting department in Tustin.

Mary Jane Allen of Seattle reported that one of our prayer partners has been invited to minister in Russia as a result of visits to Russia with Trinity. Major efforts to recruit prayer partners are continually required.

John Gordon reported that it has been a good year for the Oklahoma City station. The station is involved in local as well as network programming. The station is on Cox Cable, and when a technical problem occurred at the station, the cable operator placed the station on its system via satellite.

Jim Riddle stated it has been an interesting year in Denver. Denver now provides the office for the low power specialist. This year will see three medium power stations for Denver. A live "Praise The Lord" program occurred in December.

Phillip Crouch reported that there is a great deal of activity in Dallas. The dedication of the International Production Center is scheduled for May. An exciting week is scheduled for the last week of May. It will celebrate the beginning of Trinity, as well as the completion of the International Production Center.

Mary Laird provided a report on the Richmond, Indiana station. Their public affairs program is being broadcast by cable station on public access channels. Fellowship meetings for prayer partners occurs twice a year. Cross-training is occurring.

Scott Jackson stated that the Atlanta building is under construction, local ministers are behind the station and over 100 prayer partners have volunteered. The studio is to be completed in August.

- Dale Osborn from Canton stated that plans are being made to increase the tower height. The station wants to increase its coverage towards Cleveland. Space is being leased to the Salvation Army in an area also used by His Hand Extended. The Salvation Army handles all clothing needs.
