Dear Mr. Caton:

On behalf of Pacific Telecom Cellular, Inc. ("PTC"), this notice is submitted in accordance with Section 1.1206(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules, with the original and one copy submitted to the Commission's Secretary.

On January 27, 1994, George S. Shaginaw, Executive Vice President and General Manager of PTC, made an oral ex parte presentation concerning the above-referenced dockets to Mr. Brian F. Fontes in the office of Commissioner James H. Quello.

PTC filed a Petition For Reconsideration and a Reply in Docket 90-314, and Comments in Docket 93-253. In addition to the points addressed in the written filings, Mr. Shaginaw suggested that the Commission revisit the number and spectrum size of broadband Personal Communications Services ("PCS") licenses, possibly to provide for six 20 MHz licenses. Mr. Shaginaw also suggested that the license areas be changed from MTAs and BTAs, to MSAs and RSAs, to simplify administration of any cellular/PCS cross-ownership restriction and to avoid copyright liability issues related to the Rand McNally MTAs and BTAs. Further, Mr. Shaginaw recommended against any increase in the power limits for PCS. The current power limits promote frequency reuse in the same market area and encourage licensees to develop new services for PCS systems rather

than to construct systems which are functionally equivalent to cellular and ESMR systems.
