**Comments Requested on American Automobile Manufacturers Association
Late-Filed Comments on General Motors Research Corporation
Petition for Rule Making (RM-8308)**

On August 2, 1993, the Commission requested comments on a Petition for Rule Making filed by General Motors Research Corporation (RM-8308). This petition requested amendment of Parts 2 and 15 of the Commission's rules to permit use of the 76-77 GHz band for vehicular radar systems. Comments were due on September 1, 1993, and reply comments were due September 16, 1993.

On February 4, 1994, the American Automobile Manufacturers Association (AAMA) filed comments in this proceeding, along with a Motion for Acceptance of Late-Filed Comments.

It has been determined that AAMA's comments raise new issues that warrant giving interested parties an additional opportunity for comment. Specifically, these comments address the spectrum requirements and technical standards for vehicular radar systems.

Pursuant to Sections 4(j) and 303(r) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. Sections 154(j) and 303(r), we are hereby soliciting additional comment in RM-8308 on the issues raised by AAMA. The AAMA comments are available for inspection as part of the record in RM-8308 during normal business hours in the FCC Reference Center, Room 239, 1919 M Street, N.W., Washington, DC. Comments on these additional issues must be filed on or before **February 25, 1994**. Reply comments must be filed on or before **March 4, 1994**. To file formally in this proceeding, you must file an original and four copies of all comments and reply comments. If you want each Commissioner to receive a personal copy of your comments, you must file an original and nine copies. You should send comments and reply comments to Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, Washington, DC 20554. Comments and reply comments in this proceeding, including those filed in response to this Public Notice, are available for public inspection during regular business hours in the FCC Reference Center.
