Dear Mr. Caton:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, this letter is to advise you that Douglas G. Smith, President of Omnipoint Corporation, Mark J. Tauber of Piper & Marbury, and I met today with Commissioner Rachelle Chong and Ms. Jill Lockett, of Commissioner's Chong's staff. At the meeting, we discussed Omnipoint's position on the recent Motorola band plan and unlicensed PCS issues, including the possibility of resolving unlicensed PCS issues in a later proceeding after the proposed 1910 to 1930 MHz allocation has been finalized. Lastly, we discussed Omnipoint's position on the definition and treatment of "small business" designated entities. We gave to the Commissioner a copy of Omnipoint's January 3, 1994 Comments in GEN Docket No. 90-314, which dealt with unlicensed PCS issues, and Omnipoint's November 30, 1993 reply comments in PP Docket No. 93-253, which dealt with the definition and treatment of "small businesses."
