LFL Convention Hits National Media!

On Jan. 6, KFUO's Phyllis Housholder held a telephone interview with Dr. Gary Bauer, who is Assistant to President Ronald Reagan for Policy Development, that was picked up by United Press International and fed to UPI affiliates across the country.

Housholder questioned Bauer about the speech he would make at the Lutherans For Life convention that was to be held Jan. 9. Bauer, who authored a report titled "The Family: Preserving America's Future," addressed the convention on the same topic.

Throughout the convention, KFUO's Jerry Housholder also provided live coverage that was aired locally. He interviewed various speakers, including Bauer and Missouri Attorney General William Webster.

A message from the general manager

Satellite technology and its present day application is surrounded by an unbelievable mystique, especially as it relates to the church. Somehow we're convinced that only the secular world is entitled to its

use. Yet the church seems almost apologetic when it considers capitalizing on that technology to proclaim the Gospel.

If Luther was to arise in your living room or mine (lest we forget, he was a master at using the printing technology of his day to proclaim the Gospel of the Reformation), he would undoubtedly ask about the music permeating the room and one of us would have to explain the stereo.

Then he'd ask about the box with a glass face adorning the corner of the room and one of us would have to explain the television. He'd then, most certainly, ask how the Gospel, entrusted to us, was being heard and seen on these instruments and we'd have to say "very little."

Realistically, it doesn't have to be that way! God gives us what we need to glorify His name. Even space technology in satellites is ours. How to use it most efficiently is a more difficult question.

At KFUO, we are convinced our dynamic relevant Lutheran message of grace though faith in Christ needs to be translated into life for America now. It cannot be done effectively in this age without using satellite technology, which provides both speed to get the message out and cost savings to make it more efficient to deliver.

God has given us what we need to glorify His name. Even space technology in satellites is ours.

When our present blueprint for using satellite technology becomes a reality at KFUO, we will provide our first sister station in McCook, Neb., with Christian/Lutheran programming. Lord-willing, that will happen on Palm Sunday 1990.

That pilot project will enable us to do a needs and population assessment to better prepare for the next door the Lord opens to us.

New programming on KFUA

Recently, several new programs have been introduced into KFUA's line-up. Because KFUA must sign off earlier during winter months, we chose to expand our afternoon music offerings.

Each weekday afternoon KFUA offers two solid hours of sacred music with the program *Discoveries*. Hosted by Wayne Peterson of Northwestern College Radio, *Discoveries* offers a wide range of music style with some light commentary from Peterson that ties it all together.

Regular KFUA listeners will recognize Peterson from the popular program *Footprints* that airs each weekday morning at 11:05. Our new program, *Discoveries* with Peterson airs Monday through Friday from 1:05-3 p.m.

Another program making a recent debut on KFUA is *We Kids*. In keeping with

our commitment to provide a Christian alternative to Saturday morning cartoons, KFUA picked up this half-hour of music and Bible lessons for children. Little ones in your family will enjoy the easy-to-learn songs and will be eager to hear their name announced as "march leaders."

We Kids airs Saturday mornings at 8, right before *Kid's Corner* and *Odyssey*.

'Dial My Story'

Sharing the love of Jesus Christ with the children of metro St. Louis is what

KFUA's *Dial My Story* is all about . . . a children's telephone ministry averaging 1,000 calls per week. If you're not familiar with *Dial My Story*, call Aunt Jean at 863-LOVE and listen to her message.

The pastors at KFUA and Joan Harwell, our audio resource services assistant, have shared information about the *Dial My Story* ministry and the radio ministry of KFUA in chapel services at some metro area Lutheran schools.

Recently, a puppet named Aunt Jean was

added to our *Dial My Story* presentation. Aunt Jean sings along with the children during chapel and then she helps tell a *Dial My Story* message. The children are encouraged to be missionaries by telling their relatives and friends to call 863-LOVE, so they can hear a message about Jesus' love for them.

Several schools have contributed their offerings to the *Dial My Story* telephone ministry. Each school that contributes to the ministry has its name added to the introduction tag at the beginning of the telephone message for one month.

Dial My Story is a ministry. However, very soon KFUA plans to make the messages on audio cassettes. The audiocassettes, as well as printed messages, will be available for purchase by congregation or school outside the metro St. Louis area who may want the messages for their telephone ministry. Messages could be used in Sunday school devotions, children's sermon

The cassettes are purchased for children and grandchildren to listen home or in the car. Each of the eight recorded messages on these cassettes are approximately two minutes in length.



We are working for a local radio station. Earlier this year I was working for the local television station.





To My Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ:

Well, my second week in Saint Louis has wound down and Synod hasn't shipped me back to California; so I have to assume that things are going as well from their perspective as they are from mine.

Currently I am living on campus at the Seminary, in Mezger Hall, which I have grown to know affectionately as "the Mezger Regency." The campus housing is quite convenient, since my primary office is only about 50 yards down the road. The attached post card shows our office and broadcasting facilities. I do have to spend about a day and a half each week at a second office in Synod's International Center; but that's only a 10 to 15 minute drive from here. So my commute is great!

When I left for Saint Louis I sensed some questions among several of you regarding what my new position was and what I was going to be doing. I'd like to take a few minutes of your time to answer those questions; and I do this for three reasons:

1. To let you know what Synod's goals are through my activities/ministry.
2. To request your continual prayers to support these efforts--both in guiding me so we know we are doing the Lord's will and in opening the minds and the hearts of those people whom we will be attempting to reach.
3. To solicit your future input as our programs take shape. Your thoughts will be invaluable.

Now for the questions...and answers:

Question #1. "What is your new position?"

My official position title is Director of Broadcast Ministries, Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod.

Question #2. "What do you do?"

I can best answer this question through Synod's official "Principal Function Statement," which appears in my job description:

"The Director of Broadcast Ministries directs the radio ministry of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod. This includes the operations of radio stations KFUD-AM and KFUD-FM, along with other broadcast and audio-related activities for the purpose of serving the people of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod with high quality broadcast

and non-broadcast programs and resources that nurture Christian faith, support and supplement the witness of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod to the Gospel, and strengthen the communications efforts of local congregations throughout Synod."

Distilling that statement down, my overall responsibilities include

1. encouraging the development of creative ideas, information and resources in radio broadcasting that serve the Synod at large.
2. supervising the development, production, field-testing, distribution and evaluation of radio ministry resources for use nationally and internationally.
3. exercising administrative direction over the day-to-day operations of KFUC-AM and KFUC-FM, through their respective General Managers.
4. assuring that all program contents conform to the theological position of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod.
5. assisting the Synod colleges and seminaries in providing educational opportunities in radio.

Question #3. "Sounds great; but what do you really do?"

Before answering this question, I really feel I should share some personal thoughts with you. I came into this position assuming that Synod wanted to utilize my structured marketing and advertising experience. I hadn't fully realized how vast a ministry I was undertaking! I have quickly come to completely accept that only the Lord knows His "reasons" and His "ways." In all honesty, I would have been greatly intimidated had I been fully exposed to this ministry before arriving in Saint Louis...intimidated to the point of feeling inadequate and, perhaps, backing down.

Now that I'm here and immersed in the Lord's task, I can only marvel at the work which is to be done, the marvelous tools with which to get it done, the tremendous Christ-centered atmosphere of the workplace in which it is done, and the ease in doing it. That's not to say that the tasks are easy. The work load is very heavy. The pace is very fast. The pressures are very great. But things are not hectic. That's because of the positive perspective of my fellow workers; who, because they have turned their lives over to Jesus, have no doubts about the positive outcome of their tasks. Through them and their example, I have become totally committed to this ministry, without questioning the "reason" that the Lord chose me; and I am completely confident that He will reveal to us the "ways" He wants His tasks accomplished.

Back to what I'm doing. My twenty-plus years of marketing discipline would usually find me structuring a Master Plan, a Marketing Strategy and lots of Objective Statements and Execution Statements. In this case though, we need not go beyond a Master Plan. One only needs to recognize that all of the Execution Statements, all of the Objective Statements, all of the Marketing Strategies are included in the singular realization that the Master Plan is, indeed, the "Master's Plan."

And so, my responsibilities as Director of Broadcast Ministries are simply to assist in the communication of the "Master's Plan"; and with this communications effort go three presumptions...First, that there will be activity on the part of the people of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod because they understand and appreciate what the Master has done for them and they want to respond to His love by spreading His Plan. Second, that there will be activity on the part of the people of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod who understand and appreciate that the "Master's Plan" is bigger than individuals, group, congregations, circuits or districts; consequently, we are all part of the global mission in which The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod is involved. Third, that there will be activity on the part of people who feel good about their association with The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod...that is to say, they think of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod, and all of its entities, as themselves. They are eager to say "I am The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod." Note that each of these presumptions places an emphasis on the word "activity." Therein lies the key: we must all be actively involved in the "Master's Plan."

A vision? Most certainly it is a vision; but just as certainly, it is a vision which is highly workable and attainable.

Over the years, the business world has used a formula which is also applicable in the church world:

"Knowledge, attitude and skill determine action."

In the church world, however, the words "knowledge", "attitude" and "skill" take on a special meaning. We who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ have a special "knowledge" which comes from God's revelation to us. Through His Holy Word we are made wise regarding salvation. We who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ have an "attitude" of Faith. We who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ recognize that our "skills" are gifts from God. They are His "skills," loaned to us so that we will be equipped as saints to do the task of ministry; and we are charged with the task of equipping others.

So now, our collective goal, our collective vision, our collective ministry comes into a different focus...because our Christian "knowledge", our Christian "attitude" and our Christian "skills" will determine positive Christian "actions" towards the fulfillment of the "Master's Plan."

My personal responsibility as Director of Broadcast Ministries is, therefore, to develop communication plans for members and non-members of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod, which will increase "knowledge" levels, affect "attitudes", sharpen "skills" and motivate people to "action"...to the end that the Lord is glorified and His Kingdom is extended through all of us in The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod.

One additional observation: I know now that the Lord does, indeed, have a sense of humor. Otherwise, why would He have called an Italian from California to send him to Saint Louis to communicate with a group of Germans?

I mentioned earlier that there were three reasons for writing this letter to you. The most important one is to ask for your continual prayer, not just for me personally in my new challenges; but for the overall ministries in which I am involved, for everyone else involved in them, and ultimately for everyone to
