E. Obligation Of The Customer

F. Termination Of Service For Cause

6.2.1 TWO-POINT MESSAGE TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICE

A. Class Of Calls (Cont'd)

3. Operator-Handled Station-to-Station

Applies when calls are completed with the assistance of an operator including collect and calling card calls (except in 1. and 2. above and 4. following.) Operator Station-to-Station also applies when calls originate at a coin telephone and when a customer asks that a completed dial station-to-station call be billed to another telephone number.

4. Operator-Handled Person-to-Person

Applies when a calling station names the particular party to be reached by an operator. The party may be:

- A person;
- A station, department or office reached through a PBX attendant.

a. Person-to-Person also applies when the calling party:

- Cannot speak to the intended person or station but agrees to speak to someone else.
- Requests an operator to make arrangements with a person to receive a call at a specified time.

b. If alternative billing, i.e., Calling Card, Collect, calls billed to (another number, is requested, only the Operator-Handled Person-to-Person rate applies in addition to the Initial and Additional Minute Rate.

6.3.15 VOLUME DISCOUNT

A. Description

Message Telecommunication Service (MTS) Volume Discount is an optional toll calling discount plan.

Discounts are based on the monthly minimum selected by the customer. The discount will apply to the customer's total amount of intraLATA toll billed each month.

B. Regulations

1. The discount does not apply to the following:

- To Public or Shared Payphone Service;
- To Directory Assistance, Verification/Interrupt Service or Conference Service;
- Public Access Line (PAL) customers with flat rate service

(D)

2. When the customer initially subscribes or disconnects this service, if a partial month is billed and the customer meets the minimum charge subscribed to, the discount will apply. If the minimum charge subscribed to requirement is not met on the partial month, regular MTS rates will apply for the partial month.

3. This discount plan will be discontinued when a customer places local exchange service on full suspension.

4. This discount plan is not available with any other Company optional toll calling plan, concession or MTS discount specified in 6.2.1.E.

5. This service is offered, subject to the continuing availability of long distance message telecommunications facilities and capacity with other services rendered by the Company having preference. The Company may terminate or refuse to furnish service hereunder, if the use of the service would interface with or impair this or any other service rendered by the Company.

6. This service is available to Public Access Line (PAL) customers with measured service.

B. Definitions (Cont'd)

Network Control Signaling

The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications network which perform functions such as supervision (control, status, and charging signals), address signaling (e.g., dialing) calling and called number identification, audible tone signals (call progress signals indicating re-order or busy conditions) to control the operation of the switching machine in the telecommunications network.

Airtime

The time interval between radio channel seizure and release of a radio channel by a mobile unit or base station.

Radio Link Charge

A usage charge which is billed to the mobile unit and applies to all calls attempted or completed to or from another telephone or between mobile units. The radio link charge does not apply to land-originated mobile terminated attempts in which the mobile unit fails to acknowledge or does not answer.

- When channel seizure begins in one time period and completes in another time period, the effective rates will be billed for the appropriate minutes of use in each of the time periods. Holidays will be considered as the day of the week on which they occur.

C. Regulations

The regulations specified in this 5.9.1 for Mobile Telephone Service are in addition to the general regulations for Exchange and Network Services. In the event provisions shown elsewhere in this Tariff are in conflict with the terms of 5.9.1, the terms of 5.9.1 shall apply.

1. Mobile Telephone Service is available to mobile units equipped for this service when within range of a Mobile Telephone Service base station through which such service is furnished, subject to transmission, atmospheric and like limitations, provided however, that the Company reserves the right to refuse to connect calls to or from any mobile unit which regularly places more calls through one particular foreign base station than through its base station of registry on a monthly basis.

2. Obligation of the Customer

- a. The calling party (or customer) shall establish his identity in the course of any communication as often as may be necessary.
- b. The calling party (or customer) shall be solely responsible for establishing the identity of the person or persons with whom connection is made at the called station.
- c. The customer's use of the radio transmitter on the mobile unit shall at all times be subject to the control of the operator at the Mobile Telephone Service base station of the Company.

3. Initial Contract Period and Contract Cancellation of Service by Customer

a. Contract Period

The initial contract period for service and facilities is one month.

b. Cancellation by Customer

Service and facilities may be terminated by the customer at any time subject to payment of full charges for the period service is rendered except that if cancellation occurs within the initial contract period, charges apply for the full initial contract period.

4. Directory Listings

- a. One listing, termed the primary listing, is provided without charge in the directory of the principal exchange or, at the request of the customer, the primary listing may be provided in the directory of another exchange within the mobile service area as specified in D.1.
- b. Directory listing services, other than the primary listing, will be furnished at rates and charges as specified in 5.7.1.

5. Denial of Service

- a. In the event of the nonpayment of any sum due the Company, the use of foul or profane expressions, the impersonation of another with fraudulent intent, or of any other violation of the lawful regulations of the Company, of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, or of the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, the Company may either temporarily deny service, or terminate the contract.
- b. When the service of a customer has been temporarily denied in accordance with the preceding paragraph, but the contract has not been terminated or the order to remove the service has not been issued and completed, such service will be restored upon the payment of the appropriate service and equipment charge in addition to all charges due up to the date of suspension.
- c. Only one mobile radio transmitter will be permitted to be utilized with each mobile telephone number assigned by the Company.

7. Limited Conversation

The Company reserves the right to limit the length of conversation when necessary in times of emergency resulting in a shortage of facilities.

8. Liability of Telephone Company

- a. See Section 2 and herein.
- b. In the event of an interruption of the service, which is not due to the negligence or willful act of the customer, there will be allowed a pro rata adjustment of fixed monthly charges, assessed by the Company, involved for Company service and facilities rendered useless and inoperative by reason of the interruption during the time said interruption continues in excess of twenty-four hours from the time it is reported to the Company or detected by the Company. For the purpose of administering this regulation, every month is considered to have thirty days.
- c. The liability of the Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors, or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service or facilities and not caused by negligence of the customer, or of the Company in failing to maintain proper standards of maintenance and operation and to exercise reasonable supervision, shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which mistake, omission, interruption, delay, error, or defect in transmission occurs.
- d. In addition and not by way of limitation, in the event that there is any delay in installation of service, if any service date is promised, or any failure to service or properly maintain the items of service as provided in A5., then the liability regulation for refunds in Section 2, shall be the exclusive remedy against the Company.

The radio link charge applies on all calls attempted or completed to or from a mobile unit. Radio link charge does not apply to land-originated mobile-terminated attempts in which the mobile unit fails to acknowledge or does not answer.

All radio link charges are billed to the mobile unit. On calls between mobile units, one radio link charge will be billed to each mobile unit, unless only one radio channel is utilized in which case the radio link charge will be billed to the originating unit.

In addition to the preceding radio link charge, intraLATA toll calls accessing a toll operator are subject to the MTS schedule of charges and the operator-handled service charge as specified in 6.2.1. Operator handled local calls are subject to the charge as specified in 5.5.1.

4. Calls to Directory Assistance are charged as specified in 5.7.2.

5. Roamer Service

A. Description

This Tariff applies to Rural (fixed station) Radio Telephone Service furnished by the Company.

B. Regulations

The regulations specified in this 5.9.4 for Rural Radio Service are in addition to the general regulations for Exchange and Network Services. In the event provisions shown elsewhere in this Tariff are in conflict with the terms of A5.9.4, the terms of this 5.9.4 shall apply.

1. Definitions

- a. Type II Rural Radio Service is a communication service furnished through a general mobile base station, between a rural customer station and a land line telephone, between a rural customer station and a mobile telephone or between two rural customer stations.
- b. A rural customer station is a fixed radio telephone licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for Rural Radio Service and used by a customer for communications.

2. Availability of Service

- a. Rural customer station service is available at locations within range of a CO base station, or a general mobile base station. Such service is furnished subject to geographical features, atmospheric and other like transmission limitations of radio signals.
- b. Rural Radio Service is provided only in remote areas where it is impracticable to provide service by means of regular land line facilities. At such time as it becomes practicable to service a customer by land line, the rural customer station may be disconnected.
- c. Rural customer stations served through a general mobile base station are provided only where the furnishing of such service will not degrade the service to mobile customers served through the base station. At such time as a rural customer station degrades service to general mobile customers, the rural customer station may be disconnected or removed from the general mobile telephone service base station.
- d. Rural Radio Service is provided at the rates and charges shown herein where facilities and associated equipment are available or can readily be made available without any unusual costs. Where unusual costs are involved, additional installation, service and equipment, construction and/or termination charges may apply depending on the circumstances in each individual case.
- e. Suspension of Service - See Section 2.

- c. The calling party (or customer) shall be solely responsible for establishing the identity of the person or persons with whom connection is made at the called station.
- d. The customer's use of Rural Radio Service shall at all times be subject to the control of the operator of either the Company's CO base station, or the general mobile base station and will be used so as not to adversely degrade the service to other customers served through the same base station.

4. Limited Conversation

The Company reserves the right to limit the length of conversation, when necessary in times of emergency resulting from a shortage of facilities.

5. Initial Contract Period and Termination of Service by Customer or Applicant.

a. Contract Period

Type II Rural Radio Service and facilities are subject to a one month (minimum FCC License requirement) initial contract period.

b. Termination by customer

Service or facilities may be terminated by the customer at any time, subject to payment of full charges for the period service is rendered, except that, if termination occurs within the initial contract period, regular monthly charges apply for the remaining period, or fraction thereof, of the initial contract period. If an applicant for service cancels its request for service, prior to the establishment of such service, all related engineering and construction expense incurred by the Company will become due and payable by the applicant upon billing of such costs by the Company.
