CORPORATE STRUCTURE AND ITS LIST OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS**


Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company ("Scripps Howard"), licensee of Station WMAR-TV, Baltimore, Maryland, through counsel, hereby moves to reopen the record for the acceptance of the attached Amendment to its application. This Amendment describes the results of a pro forma corporate reorganization and updates the list of officers and directors previously provided in the Integration and Diversification Statement filed May 3, 1993.

Good cause exists for accepting this amendment which is being filed to maintain the accuracy of the information in Scripps Howard's application. Acceptance of the Amendment will

not affect the course of this proceeding, and Scripps Howard will not seek or receive any comparative benefit from its acceptance.

**AMENDMENT**

**Corporate Reorganization**

1. The E.W. Scripps Company and Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company on October 10, 1994, completed a corporate reorganization that was approved for all the Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company stations under "short-form" assignment and transfer of control applications. See, e.g., BALCT-940525LE and BTCCT-940525LL. Under this two-step reorganization, Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company has returned to the status of a fully owned subsidiary of Scripps Howard, Inc. and The E.W. Scripps Company.

2. The reorganization began with the merger of Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company into a new company with the same articles of incorporation and bylaws, and an exchange of all of the old Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company's common shares that were owned by the public (14%) for Class A common shares in The E.W. Scripps Company--thereby temporarily bringing the ownership of the new Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company directly under The E.W. Scripps Company. This phase was completed on September 15, 1994.

3. In the second phase of the reorganization, The E.W. Scripps Company transferred back to the former intermediary holding company, Scripps Howard, Inc., 100% of the shares of the new Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company. This reestablished the pre-reorganization corporate hierarchy whereby Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company is a subsidiary of Scripps Howard, Inc., which in turn is a 100%-owned subsidiary of The E.W. Scripps

Company. Thus, the only substantive change resulting from the reorganization was that Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company became a 100% subsidiary of Scripps Howard, Inc. instead of an 86%-owned subsidiary.

Changes in Officers and Directors

4. The changes in Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company's officers and directors that have occurred since the filing of the Integration and Diversification Statement in May of 1993 include that the officers who served as general managers of the now divested television and radio stations in Memphis and the radio stations in Baltimore and Portland, see Statement filed December 29, 1993, are no longer officers of the company. These former officers and the respective divested stations are:

James P. Fox, WVRT-FM, Baltimore, MD  
Edward T. Hardy, KUPL(AM & FM), Portland, OR  
Donald W. Meyers, WMC(AM & FM), Memphis, TN  
Ronald G. Klayman, WMC-TV, Memphis, TN

5. In addition, Clint W. Pace, Vice President, Sales, left the company in 1993. At Station KNXV(TV), Phoenix, AZ, Raymond Hunt, formerly the station's General Manager, has recently left the company and is no longer an officer. Brad Nilsen has been promoted to the position of Vice President and General Manager of that station, an officer's position. Also, Robert A. Rowe, formerly Vice President, News, has recently accepted a new assignment at Station KNXV(TV), and is no longer an officer of the company.


6. As previously reported, Arnold J. Kleiner, formerly Vice President and General Manager of Station WMAR-TV in

Baltimore, resigned from the company in the summer of 1993. H. Joseph Lewin was brought in from a long tenure in broadcast station management outside the Scripps companies in October of 1993 to take the officer's position of Vice President and General Manager of that station. See also Hearing Transcript at 459 (testimony of Emily Barr, November 8, 1993).

7. Two new directors of Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company have been elected. William R. Burleigh--formerly head of The E.W. Scripps Company's newspaper division and now President and Chief Operating Officer of The E.W. Scripps Company--has joined the board, as has Paul F. ("Frank") Gardner, the Senior Vice-President, Broadcasting of Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company.


8. The number of directors of Scripps Howard Broadcasting Company also has been reduced from seven to five. Accordingly, Donald L. Perris, Gordon E. Heffern, Robert E. Stautberg, and John H. Burlingame have left the board. Mr. Burlingame's tenure as Chairman of the Executive Committee of the board of directors has likewise terminated. Finally, Charles E. Scripps, while still a director, has retired from his position as the board's chairman.
