Dear Commissioner Quello;


I am the Technical Detective of the Hollywood Police Department Fl. I am also a member of the High Intensity Drug Task Force Area (HIDTA) in the South Broward Drug Enforcement Unit. Our agency has purchased the Teletrac System and uses it on a daily basis. It is now used in several long and short term cases. We cannot count the hundreds of man hours saved due to this technology. Our most use of the system is in the Court Ordered covert installation of the transmitters on target vehicles in long term wiretap cases.

You cannot imagine the frustration to a surveillance team and departmental managers. When upon their arrival at the targets' residence to initiate the surveillance, the vehicle is gone. The operation is then ended and that day is lost. With the use of the Teletrac system the vehicle can be located before the team deploying.

The system has been recommended for purchasing to every Agent I Meet, when it becomes available in their area. I have done so Due to the incredible aid it is to law enforcement in the 90's. I hope that other areas in Florida will be operational in the future. If any of our South Florida targets travel to another area in the state this valuable intelligence can be shared with the jurisdiction in that area. Our agency is fortunate that we are in the center of the tri-county area Teletrac covers now and the coverage meets our needs. What about the other jurisdiction that it does not?

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter. I hope I have articulated my need and appreciation of the system and give you a look at one small aspect of the systems advantages.
