MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

Adopted: November 15, 1994; Released: November 16, 1994

By the Acting Chief, Tariff Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

1. On October 6, 1994, the Bell Atlantic Telephone Companies (Bell Atlantic) filed Transmittal No. 702 to revise Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, its special access collocation tariff. Bell Atlantic proposes to include the construction charges for physical collocation arrangements in Section 19.8 of its tariff. According to Bell Atlantic, these charges represent the actual expenses incurred by Bell Atlantic to implement a physical collocation arrangement in the GTBGMDGB, MCLNVALV, and PITBPADT central offices, located at Gaithersburg, Maryland, McLean, Virginia, and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, respectively. Description and Justification at 1. No petitions were filed against this tariff. Transmittal No. 702 is scheduled to take effect on November 20, 1994.

2. This transmittal raises the same issues regarding cost allocations, rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of service as those identified in the Expanded Interconnection Tariff Order.¹ Therefore, Transmittal No. 702 is suspended for one day, until November 21, 1994, and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the Expanded Interconnection Tariff Order. These rates will also be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and Section 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 0.291, the revisions to Bell Atlantic Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Transmittal No. 702, ARE SUSPENDED for one day and an investigation of the referenced tariff transmittal IS INSTITUTED.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Bell Atlantic SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for these purposes, we waive Sections 61.56, 61.58 and 61.59 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 61.56, 61.58, and 61.59. Bell Atlantic should cite the "DA" number of the instant Order as the authority for this filing.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), Bell Atlantic shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are the subject of this investigation.
