
TO: Office of the Secretary,

The following comments are provided in response to the Commission's First Notice of Proposed Rule Making in the matter of the Revision of the Commission's Rules to Ensure Compatibility with Enhanced 911 Emergency Calling Systems, CC Docket Number 94-102, RM-8143, released October 19, 1994.

The Bexar Metro 9-1-1 Network District represents, for the purpose of emergency communications and specifically Enhanced 9-1-1 operation, the approximately two million citizens of the Counties of Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe, and Medina in the State of Texas. In that capacity, we participated as a presenter and conference member in both the July and October 1994 Joint Experts Meetings on this subject; we played an active role in preparing the final Wireless Emergency Services JEM Report; and we closely collaborated with and supported the Texas Advisory Commission on State Emergency Communications with regard to their response to the NPRM 94-102.
