O R D E R

Under consideration is the Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement, filed by GTE Mobilnet Incorporated (GTE), Contel Cellular Inc. (Contel), Telephone and Data Systems, Inc. (TDS) and United States Cellular Corporation (USCC), filed on January 12, 1995.

This office takes notice of a recent Federal Communications Commission's Public Notice, dated February 3, 1995, Report No. CL-95-45, in which it states that a similar request to the one identified above from the same Parties, but addressed to the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, "is hereby approved pursuant to Section 22.927 of the Commission's rules," and that "... GTE's application for the Wisconsin 8 RSA is hereby dismissed with prejudice." Accordingly, the joint request addressed to the Presiding Judge, to the extent that it seeks approval of the agreement and dismissal of GTE's application for the Vernon, Wisconsin, has been rendered moot. The sole remaining relief sought by the Petitioners in the Joint Request addressed to this office is that GTE be permitted to withdraw from this proceeding. The Presiding Judge finds good cause for granting such relief.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, that the Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement, filed by GTE Mobilnet Incorporated, Contel Cellular Inc., Telephone and Data Systems, Inc., and United States Cellular Corporation, filed on January 12, 1995, to the extent that it has not been rendered moot by prior action of this Commission, IS GRANTED, and GTE Mobilnet Incorporated IS GRANTED LEAVE TO WITHDRAW WITH PREJUDICE FROM THIS PROCEEDING.
