We, as concerned citizens of this community, are in agreement with the FCC for the enhancement and/or upgrade of the 911 Emergency calling system. We feel that it is in the public's best interest in order to assure prompt and efficient service in a life threatening situation.

We feel it is necessary for individuals with wireless communication devices to be immediately located in case of an emergency. When a customer makes a purchase of such a device at that time they should be notified whether this feature is available to them. All the sectors whether private or public should make the effort to participate in making this proposal a rule. If an incentive would be helpful in implementing this enhancement, then it should be taken under consideration. It is a priority that this takes place since the welfare of the community would be at stake.

We also have a suggestion, for instance, a new line for non-emergency callers should be taken under consideration. This would be a system similar to the 911 which would provide quick and easy access to an operator for help.

In conclusion, we feel that this enhancement for these services should not be an option, but instead a readily available service offered to every citizen in the community.
