RE: *Ex Parte* Filing - CC Docket No. 92-256 (GTE ONA)

Dear Mr. Caton:

Following are responses to information Ms. Rose Crellin requested at the March 10th meeting.

1) Can GTE provide CPNI restriction on certain numbers within an account rather than all numbers?

A. No. All telephone numbers contained within a billing account must be restricted due to current GTE's system capabilities.

2) Can ESPs order CNSs from the general exchange tariffs on behalf of their clients?

A. Yes. Even though GTE prefers a blanket letter of agency from an ESP to order services on behalf of its clients, GTE will allow an ESP to order services on behalf of its clients without an agency letter in states where the following conditional language is contained in the local exchange tariff:

Each customer, such as an ESP, ordering services from the utility on behalf of its customers (the customer's clients) is responsible for payment of all rates and charges associated with the services ordered. Should a client dispute the customer's authority, the customer will be held responsible by the Company, whether or not an agency agreement (any agreement between customers and clients) exists.

In some areas, the GTE Business Office may require a letter from the ESP (on its letterhead) at the time the order for services is placed by it on behalf of their client. This is especially true if the client is paying for the service and the letter is protection for GTE if the client disputes the addition of the service. This protection is requested since GTE does not make changes to its customer's telecommunications services without customer authorization.

The rules regarding an ESP's ability to order services on behalf of its clients for the various states served by GTE are not identical due to specific requirements of each state Public Utility Commission.

3) Status of new ONA services identified in Section III.A., footnote 6 of GTE's ONA Plan. (Abbreviated Dialing and 2W DID with call transfer

A. ABBREVIATED DIALING (IILC Issue #036):

Abbreviated Dialing (AD) will only be offered in Tampa, Florida on an interim basis due to current technical limitations. The projected exchange tariff effective date is June 1, 1995. The tariffed AD arrangement in Tampa will consist of the #NX format (where N represents digits 2-9 and X represents digits 0-9) for local use only which greatly limits the availability of dialing combinations.

GTE's current switch technologies will not allow GTE to offer the preferred dialing arrangement of #NXX. GTE's interim #NX offering will use a hybrid of AIN 0.1 and current switch capabilities. The #NXX dialing capabilities are not available until the introduction of AIN 0.2 in 1996. Once AIN 0.2 is implemented, the AD dialing arrangement in Tampa will be changed to #NXX.

GTE will provide recording and rating of the call for delivery of general information via voice grade facilities. The AD subscriber may apply a charge to their end users, within the AD subscriber's local calling area, for services delivered in response to calls to an AD number. GTE will record, rate, and provide billing of calls on behalf of the AD subscriber if they choose to use GTE's Billing & Collection (B&C) services.

The Local Calling Area of the AD subscriber will be the 813 NPA for Tampa/St. Petersburg, as facilities permit. Only one (1) AD code will be assigned to an AD subscriber. The interim AD service will be delivered to the ESP via translation to a non-published 976 number.

2 WAY DID with CALL TRANSFER (IILC Issue #042):

This feature is an exchange service originating from the trunk side of the switch to the Enhanced Service Provider (ESP). 2 Way DID with Call Transfer allows DID trunks the additional capability of transferring calls to another number, while freeing the ESP to receive another call.


