

On April 13, 1995, John O'Rourke, Rory Van Tuyl, Cynthia Johnson, and I met on behalf of Hewlett Packard ("HP") with Chairman Reed E. Hundt, Mark Corbitt, of the Office of Plans and Policy, and John Nakahata, Special Assistant to the Chairman, to discuss the Commission's proposal to permit use of radio frequencies above 40 GHz. In addition to matters addressed in HP's comments in ET Docket No. 94-124, HP expressed its support for the development of a band sharing plan that would accommodate both satellite systems and LMDS systems in the 28 GHz band.
