ORDER

Adopted: April 14, 1995; Released: April 14, 1995

By the Deputy Chief, Tariff Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

1. On March 17, 1995, US West Communications, Inc. (US West) filed Transmittal No. 602 to revise its Tariff F.C.C. No. 5. Transmittal No. 602, which is scheduled to become effective on April 16, 1995, would add new rate elements for interconnector-designated equipment requested by interconnectors for virtual collocation. The rate elements include the interconnector-designated equipment, maintenance spare parts, power, installation, bay space, and alarm and monitoring of the interconnector-designated equipment. No petitions were filed against the US West transmittal.

2. The transmittal filed by US West raises the same issues as the permanent virtual collocation tariffs that were suspended for one day and made subject to the investigation initiated in the *Virtual Collocation Tariff Suspension Order*.¹ Therefore, the above-captioned transmittal is suspended for one day, until April 17, 1995, and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the *Virtual Collocation Tariff Suspension Order*. This transmittal will also be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.

The *Virtual Collocation Tariff Suspension Order* suspended for one day, imposed an accounting order, and initiated an investigation of the permanent virtual collocation tariffs filed on September 1, 1994 by the Tier 1 local exchange carriers subject to expanded interconnection requirements. In the *Phase I Designation Order*, the Bureau designated issues for investigation regarding the overhead loadings in the LECs' virtual collocation tariffs, and Bell Atlantic's maintenance-related charges. Local Exchange Carriers' Rates, Terms, and Conditions for Expanded Interconnection Through Virtual Collocation for Special Access and Switched Transport, CC Docket No. 94-97, Phase I, Order Designating Issues for Investigation, DA 95-374 (rel. Feb. 28, 1995) (*Phase I Designation Order*).


3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and Section 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 0.291, the revision to US West Communications, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, Transmittal No. 602, IS SUSPENDED for one day and an investigation of the referenced tariff transmittal IS INSTITUTED.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that US West Communications, Inc. SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for these purposes, the Division waives Sections 61.56, 61.58, and 61.59 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 61.56, 61.58, and 61.59. US West Communications, Inc. should cite the "DA" number of the instant Order as the authority for this filing.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), US West Communications, Inc. shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are the subject of this investigation.
