MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The Minority Media and Telecommunications Council ("MMTC")^{1/} respectfully moves for extensions of time of two weeks in the above referenced proceedings.


This request is made in order to afford the parties sufficient time to perform an initial analysis of the effect of Adarand Constructors v. Peña, No. 93-1841 (Supreme Court, decided June 12, 1995) on the Commission's minority ownership policies. The Commission may ultimately need to issue a supplemental NPRM addressing this question in more detail, and the Commission may need to perform a disparity study to evaluate its policies. Thus, a brief extension of time will be helpful in permitting the parties to render suggestions to the Commission on (1) how such a disparity study might be designed; (2) how a supplemental NPRM might best be fashioned, and (3) how Adarand (as well as possible Congressional

action on multiple ownership)^{2/} may affect the Commission's ability to achieve its pro-competition goals through its attribution policies. If the Commission grants this motion, it might suggest to the parties the issues they should address in their reply comments which would be of greatest assistance to the agency.

^{2/} These proceedings are closely interrelated with the proceeding on television multiple ownership, MM Docket Nos. 91-221 and 87-8, for which a two week extension of time was recently granted. The Commission has wisely aimed to render its decisions in the multiple ownership, attribution and minority ownership proceedings concurrently. Thus, the extensions of time requested here are unlikely to cause delay.
