ORDER

Issued: June 21, 1995 ; Released: June 23, 1995

IT IS ORDERED, That Administrative Law Judge Edward Luton shall serve as Presiding Judge in the above-entitled proceeding; that the hearing therein shall be convened on October 25, 1995, at 10:00 a.m., and the prehearing conference shall be held on August 23, 1995, commencing at 9:00 a.m. 1/;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That all proceedings shall take place in the Offices of the Commission, Washington, D. C.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the following procedures shall govern this case:

1/ Should an evidentiary hearing be necessary, the parties are placed on notice that this is a firm date which will not be continued absent an extraordinary showing of good cause.

By July 28, 1995, the parties SHALL meet to discuss the possibility of settling this case. 2/ As part of these discussions, the parties SHALL identify with particularity all areas of disagreement with respect to the components used in the pole attachment formula.

By August 7, 1995, the parties SHALL file a comprehensive joint report stating the prospects of settling the case. If the case has not been settled, the parties, in their joint report, SHALL identify with particularity the exact nature of the remaining disagreements with respect to the various component parts of the pole attachment formula. 3/

By August 16, 1995, the parties, individually, SHALL file a brief, not in excess of 10 pages, supporting its position with respect to the accuracy and validity of the component parts of the pole attachment formula to which there is disagreement. Appropriate legal and factual citations shall be included. In addition, with respect to each disputed figure or fact, each party SHALL identify the witness or witnesses able to support their contention, including their names, addresses, and positions.

All parties are put on notice that they are expected to be fully cognizant of Part I of the Commission's Rules and Regulations concerning Practice and Procedure.
