2.4 Standards Compliance

SmartTrunk Service is designed to all relevant International Telephone and Telegraph Consultative Committee (CCITT) and Bellcore standards.

2.5 Technical Specifications

Network Interface Requirements for ISDN customer access are described in detail in TR-TSY-000776 (Network Interface Description for ISDN Customer Access).

2.6 Regulations

2.6.1 The following regulations apply in addition to other regulations stated in this and the other tariffs of the Company, including but not limited to, the General Exchange Tariff, Section 17. For the purposes of this service, where such other regulations apply on a "per line" basis, they shall be interpreted, in this instance, to apply on a "per channel" basis.

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2.6.2 SmartTrunk Service is offered only for use with compatibly equipped FCC Part 68 registered PBX equipment. The customer will be required to select a service term for the SmartTrunk Interface consisting of 36 or 60 continuous months. Customers selecting the 36 month service term may opt to convert to the 60 month term prior to the expiration of the 36 month term. All service components, except the SmartTrunk Interface, have a minimum service term of one month.

2.6.3 SmartTrunk Service is offered only in conjunction with the CSV/CSD local service transport SmartTrunk Service compatible option and is not available on a stand-alone basis.

2.6.4 Other ancillary tariff offerings requested by the customer and compatible with this offering may be furnished in accordance with the regulations and at the rates and charges specified in the applicable section of this tariff or other tariffs of the Company. Should such ancillary services normally be applied on a "per line" basis, they will, in this instance, apply on a "per channel" basis.

A. Touch-Tone Calling Service is not applicable for DOD local exchange services associated with this offering, therefore, not chargeable.

B. The central office switching equipment (trunk termination) portion of DID Service is not applicable for DID local exchange service associated with this offering, therefore, not chargeable.

2.6.5 In addition to the rates and charges contained in this tariff, the customer is responsible for the payment of all related charges for exchange services, miscellaneous and supplemental service as specified in this and other tariffs of the Company.

- 2.6.6 Unique requests for special or modified service arrangements will be accepted, whenever possible, if not detrimental to this or other services of the Company. Such requests will be based upon cost.
- 2.6.7 In certain central offices, the additional services of Intrastate, IntraLATA Foreign Exchange (FX) Service, Foreign Serving Office (FSO) Service and TIE Service may be associated with SmartTrunk Service on a per channel basis. However, Dynamic Channel Allocation is not applicable for these services.
- (AT) 2.6.8 Upon subscribing to SmartTrunk Service, the customer may be required to change telephone numbers.
- (AT) 2.6.9 The central office from which a customer's SmartTrunk Service is physically provisioned shall be designated the customer's SmartTrunk serving office. The Telephone Company will determine a customer's SmartTrunk serving office as follows:
1. If the customer's normal serving office is SmartTrunk equipped, the customer will be provided SmartTrunk Service from their normal serving office.
 2. If the customer's normal serving office is not SmartTrunk equipped, the customer may be provided SmartTrunk Service from another SmartTrunk equipped central office located within the customer's exchange at the rates and charges specified in this Tariff.
 3. If the customer's exchange is not SmartTrunk equipped, the customer may be provided SmartTrunk Service from a SmartTrunk equipped central office located in a different exchange, if agreed to by the Telephone Company. In such cases, this Tariff is applicable in addition to the rates and charges for interoffice mileage as specified in Paragraph 4.1.4., B., of the Digital Link Services Tariff.
 4. In cases 2 and 3 preceding, when the customer's normal serving office becomes SmartTrunk equipped, their SmartTrunk Service will continue to be provided from their original SmartTrunk serving office. Should the customer subsequently request that their SmartTrunk service be provisioned from their normal serving office, the provisions and charges specified in this Tariff for moves and disconnects will apply.

2.6.10 If a customer requests SmartTrunk Service to be provisioned from an office other than the SmartTrunk serving office designated by the Company, and if agreed to by the Company, the charges specified in this Tariff are applicable in addition to the rates, charges, terms and conditions of FSO/FX Service pursuant to the "Foreign Exchange Service" and "Foreign Serving Office Service" sections of the General Exchange Tariff.

(AT) 2.6.11 Calling Line Identification (CLID).

A. CLID Service is offered on a subscription basis which requires the customer to order the service. Where CLID Service is available, any calling party, whether they subscribe to CLID Service or not, has per call blocking capability.

The Southwestern Bell Telephone calling party may prevent the delivery of Calling Party Number (CPN) to the called party by dialing an access code (*67 on their Touch-Tone pad or 1167 from a rotary telephone) immediately prior to placing a call. The access code will activate per call blocking, which is available at no charge.

If the calling party activates blocking, the CPN will not be transmitted across the line. Instead, CLID customers will receive an anonymous indicator. This anonymous indicator notifies the CLID customer that the calling party has elected to block the delivery of the telephone number.

Line Blocking for the delivery of the calling number is available upon request, at no charge, to the following entities and their employees/volunteers, for lines over which the official business of the agency is conducted including those at the residences of employees/volunteers, where an executive office of the agency registers with Southwestern Bell Telephone a need for blocking: (a) private, nonprofit, tax-exempt, domestic violence intervention agencies and (b) federal, state and local law enforcement agencies. The calling number will not be transmitted from a line equipped with this capability.

CLID subscribers are responsible for providing per line blocking on their own PBX. Southwestern Bell Telephone will transmit the anonymous indicator received from the PBX customer.

The blocking of the CPN will not be provided on calls originating from Public, Semi-Public and Customer-Owned Pay Telephone Services.

- B. In addition to the provisions of the General Exchange Tariff, Section 17, Paragraph 17.8, the calling party and customer indemnifies and saves Southwestern Bell Telephone harmless against any and all claims for damages caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the transmission to a CLID customer of a telephone number which the calling party has requested to be omitted from the telephone directory or has requested not to be disclosed to any person.
- C. CLID information may not be sold or given to another party without the caller's written permission. CLID information may only be used for: (a) routing or completion of calls, (b) billing of calls, (c) account management purposes, (d) services directly related to the call or transaction, (e) verification of calling party identity and (f) marketing products or services that are directly related to those previously acquired by the customer from the CLID services subscriber. This applies if the CLID service subscriber has an existing relationship with the customer. CLID customers failing to comply with any of these conditions will have their service terminated.

2.7 Additions

Any additions of service are subject to current rates and charges.

2.8 Moves

(CT) Installation charges are specified in the Local Exchange Tariff and this tariff will apply when a customer moves his SmartTrunk Service. Customer moves will not be considered a disconnection of service, provided the service is not interrupted.

2.9 Supersedure

SmartTrunk Service may be transferred to a new customer at the same premises location upon written concurrence of the Telephone Company. The customer to whom service is transferred will be subject to all past indebtedness, liabilities, minimum term provisions and equipment configurations currently in effect for the previous customer.

2.10 Suspension of Service Initiated by the Customer

Temporary suspension of service initiated by the customer, as provided in the General Exchange Tariff, is not applicable to service furnished under the provisions of this tariff.

2.11 Options Available Upon Expiration of the Service Term

Upon the expiration of the service term, the customer may:

1. Continue service without establishing a new service term. The SmartTrunk Interface will be provided on a month-to-month basis at the current 60-month service term rate, with no additional service commitment. (However, this rate will be subject to Company-initiated rate changes when approved by the Public Service Commission.)
2. Continue service by selecting a new service term for the SmartTrunk Interface at the current rate. The new service term will commence on the day following the expiration of the previous service term. The new rate will not be subject to Company-initiated rate changes for the duration of the service term.
3. Discontinue the service.

The Company may change any or all renewal options with the approval of the Public Service Commission.

2.12 Rate and Charge Applications

2.12.1 Recurring, installation and nonrecurring charges are applicable according to the specific schedule for the service quoted under this plan.

(CT) 2.12.2 The monthly rate applicable at the time a customer subscribes or elects an additional service term for the SmartTrunk Interface under this plan is not subject to Company-initiated increases during the life of the service term.

(CT) 2.12.3 When requested by the customer prior to installation, installation and/or special construction charges may be deferred and satisfied by making a series of consecutive payments. The installation and/or special construction charge may be deferred over a period of 12, 24, 36, 48 or 60 months, not to exceed the service term selected. Once a deferred charge payment period is selected, it will remain in effect for the duration of the period.

2.12.5 In the event that the SmartTrunk Interface is disconnected after the service is established, but prior to expiration of the service term, the customer will be required to pay a charge equaling the sum of monthly payments remaining on the service term for each SmartTrunk Interface disconnected.

2.12.6 If the customer cancels an order for service after installation of the required equipment and facilities, but before service is established, the customer agrees to pay a charge equaling the sum of monthly payments remaining on the service term as if the service had actually been established. The customer may not avoid this provision by simply extending their acceptance of the service date.

2.12.7 If the customer cancels an order for service before installation of the required equipment and facilities is completed, the customer agrees to pay all expenses incurred in connection with the handling of the request before notice of cancellation is received by the Telephone Company. This charge, however, shall not exceed all charges which would have been applicable if the service had been installed.

2.12.8 Where Dynamic Channel Allocation is not being provided, each service shall be billed at the appropriate recurring and nonrecurring charges in quantities as specified by the customer.

2.12.9 Where Dynamic Channel Allocation is being provided for DID/DOD services, the following procedure shall be applied:

1. Non-DID/DOD services shall be billed at the appropriate recurring and nonrecurring charges in quantities as specified by the customer.
2. DID/DOD service arrangements involving a single local calling scope shall be billed based upon the appropriate recurring and nonrecurring charges and in quantities equal to the difference between non-DID/DOD assigned channels and the total channels specified by the customer.
3. DID/DOD service arrangements involving mixed local calling scopes within one SI must restrict Dynamic Channel Allocation to the DID/DOD services having the smaller local calling scope. (AT) 2.12.10 Optional Features

- A. Loop Protection: Provides automatic restoration of the SmartTrunk Interface facility and physical route redundancy from the customer's serving wire center to the point nearest the customer's premises that route redundancy can be achieved in the event of a transmission failure caused by a single facility break or a single loop electronics failure.

The automatic restoration capabilities are provided through the use of intelligent components which are capable of sensing transmission failures in the fiber facilities. The primary and secondary transmission paths are separately routed in geographically and physically separate fiber optic cables up to the nearest point to the customer's premises that route redundancy can be achieved. In the event of a transmission failure, the intelligent components will automatically switch the SmartTrunk Service from the primary to the secondary transmission path within 2.0 seconds. This service is provided subject to the limitations set forth in Section 17, Paragraph 17.8.3 of the General Exchange Tariff.

1. APPLICATION OF TARIFF

- 1.1 This tariff contains the rules, regulations, terms, conditions and prices uniquely applicable to Integrated Services (IS) furnished or made available by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in its authorized territories within the state of Oklahoma.
- 1.2 Such rules, regulations, terms, conditions and prices contained herein are in addition to other applicable rules, regulations, terms, conditions and prices specified in other tariffs of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and are hereby made part of this Tariff. In the event of conflicting rules, regulations, terms or conditions, those of this Tariff shall be controlling.

2. REGULATIONS

2.1 Use of Service and Facilities

The Integrated Services provided per this Tariff are furnished pursuant to the "Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts" section of the General Exchange Tariff and are subject to all the rules and regulations therein.

2.2 Availability

All rates, charges, terms and conditions set forth herein provide for the furnishing of service where suitable facilities and equipment are available and do not create an obligation for the Company to construct such facilities or equipment especially for the provisioning of these services.

2.3 Other Tariff Offerings

- A. Other ancillary tariff offerings requested by the customer, which are compatible with and not detrimental to these offerings, may be furnished in accordance with the regulations and at rates and charges specified in the applicable section of this Tariff or other tariffs of the Company.
- B. For the purpose of these services, where such other rates and regulations apply on a "per line" basis, they shall be interpreted, in these instances, on a "per channel or line termination" basis.

2.4 Unique Service Arrangements

Unique requests for special or modified service arrangements will be accepted, whenever possible, if not detrimental to these or other services of the Company. Such requests are accepted pursuant to the "Special Service Arrangements" of the General Exchange Tariff, and will be based upon costs.

2.5 Liability

The liability of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company regarding Integrated Services is stated in the "Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts" section of the General Exchange Tariff, and is subject to all the rules and regulations therein.

2. REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.6 Payment for Service

- A. Rules, regulations, and amounts pertaining to advance payments, deposits, guaranty contracts and payments for service are found in the "Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts" section of the General Exchange Tariff.
- B. In addition to the rates and charges contained in this Tariff, the customer is responsible for the payment of all related charges for exchange services, miscellaneous and supplemental services as specified in this and other tariffs of the Company.
- C. Additions of service can be made by the payment of rates and charges effective at the time of the additions for such service.

2.7 Supersedure

A service may be transferred to a new customer at the same premises upon written concurrence of the Telephone Company. The customer to whom service is transferred will be subject to all past indebtedness, liabilities, minimum term provisions and equipment configurations currently in effect for the previous customer. A service charge, as specified in the "Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts," section of the General Exchange Tariff will be applicable in addition to rules therein.

2.8 Customer-Initiated Suspension of Service

Temporary suspension of service initiated by the customer, as provided in the "Suspension and Restoration of Service" section of the General Exchange Tariff, is not applicable to service furnished under the provisions of this Tariff.

3. INTEGRATED SERVICES DIGITAL CIRCUIT SWITCHED VOICE (CSV)/CIRCUIT SWITCHED DATA (CSD) TRANSPORT OPTIONS

3.1 Service Description

The following rate elements provide for digital CSV/CSD transport through central office switching equipment. These rate elements are charged in lieu of the rates for Local Exchange Service. Each non-additive rate element shall constitute a local exchange access arrangement and, for reporting purposes, shall be counted in combination with those of the Local Exchange Tariff and the General Exchange Tariff. These CSV/CSD local service elements are offered only in connection with services provided under this Tariff. They are not offered on a stand alone basis.

5. SMARTTRUNK SERVICE

5.1 Service Description

SmartTrunk Service provides intrastate, intraLATA access to and from the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN) for circuit-switched voice (CSV) and circuit-switched data (CSD) communications. This communication capability is provided using Integrated Services Digital Network (ISDN) architecture and ISDN services available with SmartTrunk Service use Primary Rate Interface (PRI) technology. SmartTrunk Service employs a 1.544 Mbps facility typically divided into twenty-three B channels and one D channel. B channels are used for voice and data communications while the D channel provides out-of-band signaling. SmartTrunk Service consists of two standard service components that are not offered separately nor independent of one another. SmartTrunk Service is only offered to customers served by SWBT.

5.2 Standard Service Components

- A. SmartTrunk Interface (SI) - Provides the PRI termination and a digital multichannel transmission path between the central office and the demarcation point at the customer's premises.
- B. Integrated Services Digital CSV/CSD Transport - Provides for the local use of the PSTN. Only Integrated Services Digital CSV/CSD Transport Options, noted as "Business Trunk Equivalent" in Section 3 of this Tariff, can be associated with SmartTrunk Service.

5.3 Optional Features

- A. Universal Termination - Provides continuity between the SmartTrunk Interface and the PSTN using central office equipment for FX foreign exchange, FSO, and Private Line/tie line services.
- B. Interoffice 1.544 Mbps Facility - A 1.544 Mbps facility which enables SmartTrunk Service to be obtained from an equipped central office in another exchange when the customer's normal exchange is not equipped for SmartTrunk Service.
- C. Backup D-Channel (BD-C) - In certain central offices, allows enhanced survivability of SmartTrunk links by providing automatic takeover for a failed D-Channel.
- D. Calling Line Identification (CLID) - Allows the number of the calling party to be delivered to the called party.
- E. Loop Protection - Provides automatic restoration of the SmartTrunk Interface facility and physical route redundancy from the customer's serving wire center to the point nearest the customer's demarcation point that redundancy can be achieved in the event of a transmission failure caused by a single facility break or a single loop electronics failure.

The automatic restoration capabilities are provided through use of intelligent components which are capable of sensing transmission failures in the fiber facilities. The primary and secondary transmission paths are separately routed in geographically and physically separate fiber optic cables up to the nearest point to the customer's demarcation point that route redundancy can be achieved. In the event of a transmission failure, the intelligent components will automatically switch the SmartTrunk Service from the primary to the secondary transmission path within 2.0 seconds.
