

as much, stating that this precise issue has already been raised in the ongoing universal service proceeding.⁵⁷ LDDS WorldCom believes the Commission should continue to "anticipate resolving this issue in the Universal Service proceeding...."⁵⁸

V. CONCLUSION

The Commission should act in accordance with the recommendations proposed above.


