MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

Issued: May 1, 1996

Released: May 6, 1996

1. Under consideration are "Joint Motion For One-Week Extension Of Discovery Deadline" filed April 26, 1996 by Press Broadcasting Company, Inc. (Press) and Separate Trial Staff (STS); and Opposition To Joint Motion For One-Week Extension Of Discovery Deadline filed April 30, 1996 by Rainbow Broadcasting Company (RBC) and Rainbow Broadcasting Limited (RBL).

2. Press and STS seek, for a number of reasons recited in their pleading, a one week extension, to and including June 7, 1996, of the deadline for the close of discovery. RBC and RBL oppose the instant request. They urge that grant of the extension would unduly burden RBC in the preparation and presentation for its case ¹ since the current schedule requires RBC to exchange its exhibits on June 4, 1996.

3. A solution appears at hand which should satisfy all parties. The hearing date has been moved from June 18 to June 25, 1996, but the intermediate procedural dates were not altered. See Order, FCC 96M-88, released April 29, 1996. The needs expressed by the parties can be met by also extending by one week each of the intermediate procedural dates. Accordingly, the date for completion of discovery is extended to June 7, 1996; the date for the exchange of exhibits is extended to June 11, 1996; and the date for notification of witnesses is extended to June 18, 1996.

¹ RBC has the burden of proceeding and proof on the issues.
