Dear Chairman Hunt:

I am deeply concerned about the new "rating system" for TV programming, to be developed by the television industry or FCC for use in conjunction with a "V-Chip."

A "V-Chip" and rating system must NOT be an excuse for the TV industry to shift responsibility for establishing and enforcing sound program standards off of its own shoulders onto the shoulders of beleaguered parents OR for the FCC to not enforce the broadcast indecency law -- which, as you know, was again recently upheld by the Federal courts.

Opinion polls have repeatedly shown that a large majority of the population are concerned about the glut of sex, violence and vulgarity on TV. A primary part of this concern is the effect on children and youth. But large numbers of adults are also personally offended and do not feel that TV shows represent their own values.

The TV industry says it is giving the public what it wants and that programming merely reflects reality. But opinion polls and statements from prominent liberal and conservative spokespersons show that most people do not want a steady diet of gratuitous sex, violence and vulgarity on TV, either for themselves or their children.

Nor does TV reflect "reality" for the vast majority of the American people who, unlike all too many TV characters and guests on daytime talk shows, are not jumping from bed to bed with just about anyone other than a spouse OR engaging in one violent or antisocial act after the other OR constantly cursing OR going through life without any need for God. Even many "reality-based" programs are more fiction than fact.

Not that all TV programming is offensive or harmful. But, all too often, the TV industry serves its own interests, rather than the public interest, and reflects as "reality" the lifestyles and values of a small percentage of amoral or totally depraved individuals, rather than community standards and values. Ratings and a "V-Chip" may have their place, but not to "identify" a steady stream of cultural sewage packaged as TV "entertainment." The answer to this type of programming is to curb it at its source.

It has also been brought to my attention that Congress has instructed the FCC, "in consultation with appropriate public interest groups," to determine if rules established by the TV industry for rating TV programming are acceptable and, if not acceptable, to work with "appropriate public interest groups" in order to establish its own rating system.

In either case, I urge you to include Morality in Media [212-870-3222] as one of the "public interest groups." Founded in 1962, this national, interfaith organization has been at the forefront of efforts to uphold standards of decency on radio and TV.

Dear Commissioners:

Television broadcasters have had nearly five years to keep their promises to serve America's children, and they have not delivered. Just as the concern of parents and teachers and advocacy groups has finally managed to make tighter regulation a distinct possibility, the industry is making the same old promises once again.

More alarming, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) may be on the brink of buying the line. That would be a serious mistake.

In 1990, the National PTA and the North Dakota PTA prodded Congress into passage of the Children's Television Act (CTA). It was hoped that the law would help improve the sorry state of the medium kids watched most. Industry representatives, afraid of losing their free licensed access to the limited broadcast band, promised to provide educational services for children as a public service.

But they insisted that requiring fixed hours of educational material and defining closely what "educational" meant would cripple their creativity and curb the exuberance and bounty of what TV was going to do for kids.

Congress bought this argument. The CTA now, therefore, requires stations to air "some" programming of an undefined "education" content for children.

As a result, we have seen production of program-length commercials for toys and many productions of violence and noise. Programs like *Mighty Morphin Power Rangers* and *The Jetsons* are often listed as educational programming, and the few worthwhile shows tend to run in predawn hours.

The CTA was intended to encourage production of valuable educational programming for children, and it hasn't worked. Concerned parents aren't satisfied. They care what their children watch. The FCC is rewriting the rules for implementing the CTA, and should use the opportunity to give the industry the measuring stick it needs to evaluate its own performance.

Last year, frustrated and unhappy over TV violence, parents managed to gain agreement on the V-chip from the broadcast industry. Knowing the stakes, program makers are already starting to tone down their products. This is being received with appreciation from the viewers.

The North Dakota PTA and other groups now want the FCC to define educational content carefully and to require, as a condition for renewal of broadcast licenses, that television stations air at least three hours of educational programming per week. This is truly a minimum expectation.

It is appreciated that FCC Chairman Reed E. Hundt has backed the idea and that 104 members of the Congress support it.

Broadcasters have rejected the proposed new rule as excessive - three public service hours out of the week's 168 hours would evidently put too big a dent in their profits. But faced with growing public pressure, they are suddenly promoting a so-called "compromise" they say everybody can live with.

Industry representatives are meeting privately with Chairman Hundt, trying to undermine his commitment to the three-hour standard. Instead, the stations want to be rated on their "total efforts" for children and on a "narrative statement" they would provide describing those efforts.

Don't agree to it, Mr. Chairman! This new proposal would only give the appearance of a change, not the reality of genuine program benefits for our youth. It would be a mere gesture given the industry's record on this issue.

Stand firm, Chairman Hundt, determination now will bring a response from the industry on the education front. Parents and teachers will applaud. They can turn the bad stuff off, but they can't turn on what isn't there. For that, they need a firm commitment from the FCC to the educational needs of America's children.

Last fall ABC began airing a new program, NYPD BLUE, which they said would "push the envelope" for broadcast television. NYPD BLUE contained nude sex scenes, violence and language never before aired on a commercial network.

We agree with ABC that the extreme language, sex scenes and violence are not necessary to make the program good entertainment. We also are concerned that in breaking down the barriers of acceptability, ABC is opening new doors for even more extreme sex scenes, violence and language.

We express appreciation for all advertisers that refused to support NYPD BLUE with advertising dollars last season, and ask advertisers to continue their support of better programs by refusing to support NYPD BLUE in the upcoming season.
