Dear Mr. Caton:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, this letter is to advise you that, at the request of Commission staff, Omnipoint Communications, Inc. met with several staff persons yesterday afternoon. Attending the meeting on behalf of Omnipoint were Jerry O'Brien of Omnipoint, Mark J. Tauber of Piper & Marbury L.L.P., and myself; several Commission staff persons attended the meeting, including Karen Brinkmann, David Nall, Jay Markley, and Kathryn O'Brien. During the meeting, we discussed Omnipoint's position on interconnection issues, including bill-and-keep and numbering administration, as articulated in Omnipoint's comments and reply comments in the above-referenced dockets. We also discussed the interconnection problems in Connecticut and Massachusetts, where wireless carriers are apparently required to pay for the termination of LEC traffic that terminates on the wireless carrier's network. Omnipoint also recommended that the Commission permit the RBOCs to offer short-haul transport to competing carriers across LATA boundaries in order to increase transport efficiency.
