Subject: End-User Comment

I am a software engineer who needs T-1 from an ISP 8mi away, who are themselves 25mi from the nearest POP, via no license/cost wireless, using a radio I can afford. Current ISPs in the rural areas we want to move into either do not offer T-1 speeds or charge rates far higher than in-city ISPs.

There are about 20 other engineers in this firm (total 40 engineers) who also want to move out into the rural areas, but are unable to because the costs for wireline T-1 speeds from each individual's home are prohibitive. We require at least T-1 speeds in order to telecommute using videoconferencing software, which many of our clients demand in lieu of face-to-face meetings.
