Bill Long has, at our request, volunteered to serve on a panel of satellite experts to evaluate three pioneer's preference requests made by applicants for digital audio radio services (DARS) licenses. We write to express our appreciation to Bill and to you for accommodating our request and assisting the Commission by having Bill perform this critical review.

Under separate cover we will send Bill the materials submitted by the applicants for review, along with materials that set forth the relevant criteria for review.
