

I recently purchased a townhouse and am preparing to move in. I am told that the only option for a television antenna is cablevision and that I am not allowed to install one of the 18 inch digital satellite antennas. The problem is that cablevision sends an analog signal. All the new TVS are capable of processing digital information and providing superior sound and pictures. This restriction bars me and anyone else from taking advantage of the quality pictures and sound that most new television sets provide. Cable television can process digital signals by upgrading their cable to fiber optics. In most locations, they have taken their revenues as profit and have not kept up with the times by providing their customers the best possible services available. Everyone that is purchasing the newer technology TVS that have the capability of receiving digital signals is also purchasing a DSS (digital) type antenna. It seems unfair that someone living in a townhouse or condo should be restricted from enjoying what modern technology can provide. I hope that you will consider this when ruling on Doc # 95-59.
