JOINT MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDA


The Federal Communications Commission Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, Time Warner Cable of New York City, Paragon Cable Manhattan, Cablevision of New York City Phase I, and Bartholdi Cable Company, Inc. hereby request leave from the presiding judge to file supplemental memoranda regarding the pending Joint Motion for Summary Decision no later than October 22, 1996. The parties who moved for summary decision (Bartholdi and the Wireless Bureau) each desire separately to file memoranda addressing the effect on their Motion of the testimony adduced since the time their Motion was filed.¹ The memorandum from the parties who opposed the Motion (Time Warner Cable of New York


