Dear Susan:

It was good seeing you in New York at the FCC Attorneys luncheon. Your presentation was outstanding. I agree with you that the concentration of radio and television frequency in a few corporate hands has gone as far as it should go.

Cahn Capital Corp. is involved as financial advisors to a leading company which has developed 220 MHz radio equipment. We are aware that you are presently considering the issuance of a Report and Order on 220 MHz.

Based on our knowledge of what 5 KHz has proven it can do, and the potential that narrowband offers for the spectral efficiency of refarming, we hope the service will remain only as non-aggregative 5 KHz channels. The Report and Order which created this service specifically stated that the channels could only be 5 KHz wide and non-aggregative. We believe it should remain that way.

I look forward to our paths crossing in the near future. I am confident the work you are performing at the FCC is proving challenging and rewarding.
