

ELM—e-mail


program.



INTERNET-networks connected to one another.


JOYSTICK-you use this when you're playing games on a computer. It sends messages to the computer that make you go left, right, up and down.

MAILREFLECTOR-an address that accepts e-mail messages and sends them on somewhere else.


MB-short for megabyte.

ROM-for Read Only Memory, the part


that is not erased when you turn the computer off.
