This letter is being written on behalf of Roamer One, Inc. ("Roamer") to report the substance of discussions which the undersigned has had, or is scheduled to have, with the Offices of Chairman Hundt, Commissioners Quello, Ness, and Chong, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and the Bureau's Policy Division between November 26 and December 5, 1996, with respect to the Commission's proposal to hold Phase II auctions for licenses in the 220-222 MHz band. See generally 220-222 MHz Phase II Licensing, 11 FCC Rcd 188 (1996) (PR Dkt. No. 89-522) (Second Memorandum Opinion and Order and Third Notice of Proposed Rulemaking) ("Third NPRM").


Those discussions were scheduled to discuss the substance of the November 25, 1996, ex parte letter which Roamer submitted to those offices and to the docket of the above-captioned proceeding. In its letter Roamer suggested specific auction procedures which would permit Roamer and others to participate in an anticipated 220 MHz auction on a Private Mobile Radio Service ("PMRS") basis.

In addition to the material contained in Roamer's November 25 letter, the discussions to date also focused on desirability of the Commission's explicit continuation (in the forthcoming auction decision) of existing policies which permit 220 MHz systems to be used either for Commercial Mobile Radio Service ("CMRS") or PMRS purposes. Such a continuation would appear to address the specific problems described in Roamer's November 25 letter.
