

WHAT IS ACCESS REFORM?

- An opportunity to make access rate structure more economically efficient.
- It is not Separations Reform:
 - » Bringing access rates to economic levels requires Separations Reform or competition.

ACCESS PRINCIPLES

- Revenue neutral on “Day one”
 - » Revenues reduced by rate structure & competitive effects
- Fixed costs collected on a flat-rate basis
- Usage sensitive costs recovered on a per minute basis
- Pricing flexibility commensurate with competition
