
Petition of Sky Station International, Inc. for

On Monday, March 10th, representatives of Sky Station International, Inc. ("Sky Station") met with representatives of the FCC's Wireless Bureau to discuss the proposals for using spectrum in the 47 GHz band to provide stratospheric fixed services. The discussion focused primarily on the issues outlined Sky Station's December 24, 1996 filing in the above-referenced proceeding, including the spectrum allocation and channelization plan, service rule matters, and the desire for expeditious action in this proceeding.
