In the above referenced Order on Reconsideration, several Local Exchange Carriers are required to submit a schedule of proposed refunds and refund plan within 30 days of the April 14, 1997, release date. Paragraph 50 of the Order incorrectly requires the Sprint Operating Telephone Companies to file a schedule of refunds and refund plan with respect to 800 data base query rates in accordance with the Order.

Pursuant to Paragraph 23 of the above referenced Order, the Sprint Operating Telephone Companies have no refund liability and therefore will not file a schedule of refunds and refund plan. Paragraph 23 of the Order correctly states that Sprint tariffs never exceeded the .0067 dollars rate per data base query, were never suspended, and the Commission was not ordering the Sprint local companies to issue refunds in this matter.
