
Enclosed are Certifications confirming that each of the Bell Atlantic local exchange companies has met all requirements established by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for eligibility to receive payphone compensation, beginning April 15, 1997, from your company and other interexchange carriers. The Bell Atlantic local exchange companies are Bell Atlantic - Delaware, Inc., Bell Atlantic - Maryland, Inc., Bell Atlantic - New Jersey, Inc., Bell Atlantic - Pennsylvania, Inc., Bell Atlantic - Virginia, Inc., Bell Atlantic - Washington, Inc., and Bell Atlantic - West Virginia, Inc. (collectively "Bell Atlantic").

In accordance with the orders issued by the FCC in its *Pay Telephone Reclassification Proceedings* (CC Docket No. 96-128), your company is responsible for paying its allocated share of the interim flat rate monthly compensation, effective April 15, 1997, for each Bell Atlantic payphone. This is the same compensation rate that your company has been required to pay since last year for dial around calls from all payphones operated by independent payphone providers. Beginning October 7, 1997, per call compensation shall be due from your company to Bell Atlantic based on the number of your company's calls completed from Bell Atlantic payphones.

Bell Atlantic shall provide you the specific payphone numbers (ANI) for which compensation is due as well as billing invoices setting forth the amounts due. Please notify Matthew Phillips by July 15, 1997, of the name and address of the person who should receive the bill. Mr. Phillips telephone number is (301) 282-5699 and his fax number is (301) 236-0072. Any questions about the applicable billing and collections processes, may also be directed to him.

We look forward to a mutually productive business relationship with your company.

Bell Atlantic Certification of Compliance With Requirements For Payphone Compensation in Payphone Reclassification Proceeding, CC Docket 96-128

Bell Atlantic - Pennsylvania, Inc. ("Bell Atlantic") certifies that it has met the requirements established by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to receive compensation as a payphone service provider from carriers. As set forth below, Bell Atlantic has satisfied each of the seven requirements for eligibility set forth by the FCC in paragraphs 131 and 132 of the Reconsideration Order in the Payphone Reclassification Proceeding, as clarified and modified by subsequent FCC Orders.¹

1. Cost Accounting Manual - Bell Atlantic has "an effective cost accounting manual ("CAM") filing." Bell Atlantic filed revisions to its CAM on January 31, 1997, which were approved by the FCC's CAM Order on April 15, 1997, and are now effective.

2. Interstate CCL Tariff - Bell Atlantic has "an effective interstate CCL [carrier common line] tariff reflecting a reduction for deregulated payphone costs and reflecting additional multiline subscriber line charge ("SLC") revenue." Bell Atlantic filed revisions to its interstate CCL tariff to reflect a reduction for deregulated payphone costs and additional multiline SLC revenue on December 30, 1996. These revised tariffs became effective on April 15, 1997. (Bell Atlantic Transmittal Nos. 931 and 954)

3. Removal Of Intrastate Subsidies From State Tariffs Bell Atlantic has "effective intrastate tariffs reflecting the removal of charges that recover the costs of payphones and any intrastate subsidies." Bell Atlantic withdrew those tariffs that include charges for payphone costs, including semi-public service charges. Bell Atlantic's tariffs for other exchange or access services do not recover or subsidize payphone costs. Thus, no revisions to effective tariffs were required to remove subsidies.

4. Deregulation and Reclassification of Payphone CPE Bell Atlantic "has deregulated and reclassified the value of payphone customer premises equipment ("CPE") and related costs as required in the Report and Order. Bell Atlantic's CPE and related costs were deregulated and reclassified, effective April 1, 1997, pursuant to the CAM approved by the FCC.

5. Intrastate Tariffs for Basic Payphone Services and New Services Test Bell Atlantic has "in effect intrastate tariffs for basic payphone services (for 'dumb' and 'smart' payphones)," as modified by the FCC's waiver of the "new services" test granted in its Order of April 15, 1997 (DA 97-805). Bell Atlantic filed tariffs for basic payphone services for dumb payphones on January 15, 1997, which are currently in effect. Bell Atlantic also has in effect intrastate tariffs for basic payphone services for smart payphones. On May 19, 1997, Bell Atlantic also filed cost data substantiating that its current intrastate tariff rates for each of these payphone access lines satisfy the federal new services test.

6. Interstate and Intrastate Tariffs For Unbundled Functionalities Pursuant to the FCC's limited waiver concerning interstate tariffs for unbundled functionalities (Order DA 97-678, rel. April 4, 1997), Bell Atlantic filed interstate tariffs for unbundled functionalities on May 19, 1997, in accordance with the applicable tariffing requirements, including the FCC's new services test. These tariffs became effective on June 3, 1997, subject to investigation.

Accordingly, Bell Atlantic has interstate and intrastate tariffs in effect for the following unbundled functionalities:

Optional Feature

- Line side answer supervision
- Inward blocking
- Outward Blocking
- Inward/Outward screening
- Limited Interlata Dialing

Also, pursuant to the FCC's limited waiver of the "new services" test granted in its Order of April 15, 1997 (DA 97-805), Bell Atlantic filed tariff revisions and supporting documentation substantiating that its intrastate tariffs for unbundled functionalities comply with the new services test. These filings are now pending before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

7. CEI Plan Bell Atlantic has an approved CEI (comparably efficient interconnection) plan for basic payphone services and unbundled functionalities. Bell Atlantic's CEI Plan was approved by an FCC Order released on April 15, 1997 (DA 97-791).

Accordingly, Bell Atlantic is eligible to receive flat rate interim compensation as of April 15, 1997, and per call compensation as of October 7, 1997, from carriers for each Bell Atlantic payphone.

The NYNEX telephone companies hereby certify that they have met the requirements established by the Federal Communications Commission to receive compensation from carriers. The seven requirements for eligibility were initially set forth by the Commission in paragraphs 131 and 132 of the Reconsideration Order in the Payphone Reclassification Proceeding, and have been clarified and modified by subsequent Orders. Specifically we certify the following:

- 1.) NYNEX has an effective cost accounting manual ("CAM") filing.
- 2.) NYNEX has an effective interstate CCL tariff reflecting a reduction for deregulated payphone costs and reflecting additional multi-line subscriber line charge ("SLC") revenue.
- 3.) NYNEX has effective intrastate tariff filings reflecting the removal of charges that recover the costs of payphones and any intrastate subsidies.
- 4.) NYNEX has deregulated and reclassified the value of payphone customer premises equipment ("CPE") and related costs as required in the Report and Order.
- 5.) NYNEX has in effect intrastate tariffs for basic payphone services (for "dumb" and "smart" payphones).
- 6.) NYNEX has in effect intrastate and interstate tariffs for unbundled functionalities associated with those lines.
- 7.) NYNEX has an approved Comparably Efficient Interconnection ("CEI") plan for basic payphone services and unbundled functionalities prior to receiving compensation.

Also, pursuant to the FCC's limited waiver of the "new services test" granted in its Order of April 15, 1997 (DA 97-805), NYNEX sent on May 19, 1997 to the regulatory commission in each of the NYNEX states a letter advising the agency that we have met the requirements of the "new services test" on the access lines provided to payphone providers and certain unbundled features and functions used in the provision of payphone service. That letter

included information supporting our statement to that effect. That same day we filed rate changes required in the existing intrastate tariffs so as to satisfy the "new services test" on any unbundled functionalities that were not then in compliance.

In addition, pursuant to the Commission's limited waiver of the deadline for filing the Federal tariffs for unbundled features and functions granted in its Order of April 4, 1997 (DA 97-678), NYNEX on May 19, 1997 filed Federal tariffs for unbundled features as required.

Accordingly, NYNEX is in full compliance with the applicable requirements as set forth in the Payphone Orders. NYNEX has satisfied the applicable requirements, as modified, in six (6) of the seven (7) States in which it provides payphone services as described in the attachments in this letter. It is, therefore, eligible to receive flat rate interim compensation from carriers as of April 15, 1997, in the States of; New York, Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Connecticut, and, on the first day following certification eligibility in the State of Vermont.

Furthermore, NYNEX anticipates forwarding ANI lists, and billing invoices on the 7th business day of each month beginning in July. The first bill will contain data for half of April and all of May and June. Thereafter, all billing invoices will contain monthly data only. For your convenience we have enclosed a sample invoice and an outline of our Billing and Collections practices. BILLING & COLLECTIONS FOR INTERIM COMPENSATION

Supporting Documentation PSP Reports/ ANI List: Monthly, NYNEX will send to IXCs a 3 1/2" diskette or file via a secured internet transaction that will contain the following:

- ◆ A header record (name and address of payphone provider i.e. NYNEX Public Communications (Pub Comm).
- ◆ ANI listing (10 digits).
- ◆ A Y/N inmate identifier (N= not an inmate phone).

This report will be sent monthly by NYNEX regulated operations (LEC) and Pub Comm and it will include all payphones.

Data will be compiled as of last date of the monthly report period (e.g. 5/31).

These monthly reports - will be sent within seven (7) business days after the end of the report period.

Billing:

Invoices will be issued monthly, within seven (7) business days after the end of the report period.

The invoice will be mailed to the IXC or the IXC's designated clearinghouse operator.

Terms - The invoice will be due within 30 days from the invoice date. Charges will be applied for late payment starting on the 31st day. No late payment charges will be applied to items while they are in dispute.

In situations where less than a full month is to be billed, a prorated amount will be calculated based on the number of days in the month being billed.

The invoice will be formatted on a State-by-State basis and include the following information:

- bill to name and address
- IXC name and address
- invoice date
- invoice identifying information

Payment Due Date: All Interim Compensation bills are due for payment 30 days after the bill date.

When the payment date falls on a weekend or holiday during the week, the payment date is as follows:

Late Payment Charges: Late Payment Charges (LPC) of 18% will be assessed on all undisputed charges, beginning the first day following the due date. LPC will apply to disputed amounts 15 days after dispute is resolved.

Collection Procedures

- 15 Calendar Days - Forward letter - Certified
- 30 Calendar Days - File complaint with FCC
- 90 Days - File legal action
- Example:
 - June 6th - ANI Report as of 5/31
 - June 10th - Date of Invoice (includes all activity thru 5/31)
 - July 10th - Payment Due (30 days after invoice)
 - July 25th - Certified Letter (45 days after invoice)
 - August 25th - FCC Complaint (75 days after invoice, 30 days after certified letters)

Failure To Pay: After 75 days of bill date, if an IXC fails to remit payment of compensation charges due and 30 days written notice by Certified Mail has expired then NYNEX Pub Comm may initiate formal complaint with the FCC for failure to pay. Lawsuits may be initiated by Pub Comm for any unpaid amount anytime after 90 days of the bill date.

Final Bills/ Write-Off: Final Bill & Write-Off procedures will replicate the business methodology used today for carrier services.

Dispute Resolution:

- ◆ All disputes or claims by IXCs should initiate within 15 days of receipt of the bill. IXCs are required to deduct the disputed amount from the total amount due and remit payment immediately for the non-disputed amount.
- ◆ No collection treatment will apply for disputed amounts. Pub Comm will investigate any disputed mismatches and issue report to the IXC.
- ◆ Most disputes should be resolved within 15 - 30 days. LEC records will prevail. Pub Comm will impose late payment charges 15 days after dispute is resolved.
- ◆ Disputes are considered to be resolved when supporting documentation is submitted to IXC by LEC or Pub Comm.

Comparison of Data

The comparison process matches on three levels:

1. Does the ANI claimed by Pub Comm appear in the LEC database?
2. Has another IPP claimed the same ANI?
3. Does the information of PSP submitted by Pub Comm match the information provided by the LEC?

Disputes - Types and Resolution

- Pub Comm ANI was not reported in LEC database.

Pub Comm must contact the LEC and have the LEC submit written verification that the ANI was in place on the last day of the month in dispute. Both connect and disconnect dates must be included if the dispute is over several months.

- ANI claimed by more than one IPP.

Pub Comm will submit a copy of the LEC bill to Pub Comm from the last day of the month in dispute or obtain other verification from LEC.

- Pub Comm data does not match LEC records.

Pub Comm will submit verification from LEC.
