**FCC ANNOUNCES THAT THE NORTH AMERICAN NUMBERING
COUNCIL ESTABLISHED A CO-CHAIR FOR THE COUNCIL, AND
WELCOMED A NEW NARUC MEMBER**

At the twelfth meeting of the North American Numbering Council (NANC), held on Tuesday, July, 22 1997, at 8:30 A.M. EST at the Federal Communications Commission, 1919 M Street, NW, Room 856, Washington, DC, NANC Chairman, Alan Hasselwander announced that Ms. Heather Burnett Gold will serve as Co-Chair to the Council. Chairman Hasselwander also welcomed the new National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) member to the Council, Colorado Public Utilities Commissioner, Vince Majkowski, and his alternate Bruce H. Armstrong. Commissioner Majkowski, and Mr. Armstrong are replacing former Commissioner Kenneth McClure, Missouri Public Service Commission and his alternate, Dr. Ben Childers.
