Dear Mr. Caton:

This letter is to notify you that, on August 15 & 16, 1997, Douglas Smith and I discussed with Mr. Jon Garcia, of the Commission's Office of Plans and Policy, issues concerning possible PCS Entrepreneur's Band auction debt restructuring. Omnipoint expressed concern that a disaggregation program whereby C Block licensees could retain 15 MHz and turn in 15 MHz could create implementation problems and a perception that the Commission was creating another entrant in the PCS bandplan. We emphasized that an amnesty program must take into account that some C Block licensees have already commenced service or have undertaken significant infrastructure investment in their C Block systems. We also discussed possible ways that such disadvantages might be mitigated in an amnesty program.
