He regularly communicates with the National Rural Health Association, the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health, the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy and representatives of the Federal Communications Commission on telecommunications issues.

Mr. Lineberry and the Office of Rural Health Policy have been extensively involved in telecommunications issues related to the 1996 Telecommunications Act. He fully understands the enormous potential benefit that the Rural Health Care component of the Universal Service Fund will have on rural health care providers across the broad spectrum of telemedicine and particularly "Telehealth" applications.


Isiah Lineberry is Director of the Office of Rural Health Policy within the Bureau for Public Health.
