Dear Mr. Caton:

On September 8, 1997, Cathleen Massey, Vice President - External Affairs, for AT&T Wireless Services, Inc., and Rick D. Bailey, Vice President - Federal Government Affairs, for AT&T Corp., and the undersigned, met with Dan Phythyon of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss matters raised in AT&T's comments in the above-captioned proceedings.

Specifically, regarding fixed services, AT&T argued that such services should continue to be regulated as CMRS until the service becomes a substitute for landline

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local service in a substantial portion of a state. AT&T also asked the Commission to act quickly to adopt an automatic roaming rule given AT&T's pending lawsuit against SouthwestCo Wireless in Arizona for failure to honor its contract to provide automatic roaming. AT&T also emphasized the importance to CMRS providers of resolution of the pending proceeding regarding the preemption of the City of Roseville, Minnesota's telecommunications ordinances. Finally, AT&T argued that it is critical that the Commission recognize its ability to preempt, under the authority of Section 332(c)(7)(B)(iv), any inconsistent or additional burdens related to RF emissions that State and local governments might attempt to impose.
