I recently learned of a petition which was filed by the Land Mobile Communications Council (designated RM-9267). It is my understanding that this petition seeks to reallocate valuable radio spectrum, now utilized by Radio Amateurs, to profiteers of the aforementioned organization.

This is clearly not in the interest of the Amateur Radio Community or the public. Amateur operators are a likely target of business and industry because of a lack of funding and perceived lack of influence to combat their "deep pocket" interests. I urge you to leave 420-430 and 440-450 MHz assigned as it currently is. Furthermore, I urge you to look at future proposals of this nature carefully. Amateurs value that portion of the radio spectrum allotted for our use and want to be assured that it will be there for us and future generations of amateurs to utilize.

I have taken this opportunity to contact Senators Jesse Helms and Lauch Faircloth and share my feelings with them. Additionally, I am urging all HAMS to do likewise.



Our customers, our company and many other companies such as ours live in the private wireless world and we all need access to private wireless spectrum.
