Dear Ms. Salas:

I am writing today in support of the petition for rulemaking filed by the LMCC seeking new spectrum allocations for private wireless users. I applaud the FCC For quickly placing the petition on public notice.

I am involved with the land mobile industry in that my company is an authorized Motorola dealer and servicer. My company employs 20 people and we service a customer base of well over 1000 local businesses and governmental agencies in the heavily industrialized area of northwest Indiana. Among our customers are steel mills, chemical and petroleum manufacturers and all ancillary services who rely heavily on radio two-way communication to operate their businesses in a safe and efficient manner. It would not be an exaggeration to say that the primary problem we face today is the lack of available spectrum. Heavily used frequencies bog down existing communications systems and impede expansion.

Commercial radio systems such as cellular, PCS, Nextel, etc. have impacted our marketplace but they are not always the appropriate vehicle. A large portion of our potential customer base finds it beneficial to use dispatch style radio system which affords them immediate accessibility to those they need to talk to.

It is imperative to our industry and to our customers that additional spectrum be allocated to the use of private wireless entities. Efficient radio communications are the lifeblood of our businesses. I urge you to address this issue quickly as the problems associated with the lack of spectrum continue to increase
