**MASS MEDIA BUREAU'S FURTHER COMMENTS ON
JOINT REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT
AND MOTION TO INTERVENE**

1. On February 12, 1998, the Mass Media Bureau filed consolidated comments on a joint request for approval of agreement filed January 30, 1998, by Normandy Broadcasting Corp. ("Normandy") and Lawrence N. Brandt ("Brandt"), and on a motion to intervene filed January 30, 1998, by Entertronics, Inc. The thrust of those comments was that the proposed settlement was in the public interest. However, the joint request also argued that the assignment of Normandy's stations, WCQL(FM) and WWSC(AM), to Entertronics was an integral part of the settlement. Because the assignment applications had only recently been filed with the Commission, the Bureau informed the Commission that, upon completion of their processing, it would report to the Commission whether the assignee was fully qualified



and whether grant of the assignment applications would serve the public interest.

2. The Bureau has completed its processing and has determined that the assignee is fully qualified and that grant of the applications will serve the public interest. Accordingly, the Bureau reiterates its support for the joint request, dismissal of Brandt's application, grant of Normandy's application, and termination of this proceeding.
