**BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF SECOND APPLICATION BY BELLSOUTH
FOR PROVISION OF IN-REGION, INTERLATA SERVICES IN LOUISIANA**

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July 9, 1998

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is BellSouth's second application for section 271 relief in Louisiana. In rejecting BellSouth's initial application, the Commission concluded that BellSouth had failed fully to implement the "competitive checklist" of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 ("1996 Act").⁴⁷ U.S.C. § 271(c)(2)(B).ⁱ Specifically, the Commission denied BellSouth's request for relief because it found BellSouth had failed to provide nondiscriminatory access to its operations support systems ("OSSs"), and had refused to offer contract service arrangements ("CSAs") at a wholesale discount.

In the months that have passed since the Commission rendered its decision, BellSouth has addressed these concerns, as well as those articulated by the Commission in its South Carolina Order.ⁱⁱ In so doing, and through its other ongoing measures to open local markets, BellSouth has fully complied with the competitive checklist and all other requirements of section 271.ⁱⁱⁱ

BellSouth's steps have included further enhancements to its OSSs and related interfaces. For example, BellSouth has released an enhanced EDI interface that offers CLECs electronic access to additional pre-ordering and ordering information; developed electronic tools that help CLECs submit error-free orders; distributed specifications that permit any CLEC to construct an integrated pre-ordering/ordering interface; conducted additional testing to confirm that

BellSouth's systems work as designed and have ample spare capacity to meet foreseeable demand; and instituted a set of service quality measurements that enables CLECs to monitor their own access to OSSs, so they can confirm they are receiving nondiscriminatory access.

BellSouth also has made its CSAs available for resale at the contract price, less the applicable wholesale discount. By making CSAs available at the wholesale rate, BellSouth has eliminated the possibility, raised by the Commission in its Louisiana Order, that BellSouth might attempt to convert large customers to CSAs to avoid the resale discount. Louisiana Order, 13 FCC Rcd at 6284, ¶ 64. BellSouth has incorporated this new pricing for CSAs into its state-approved Statement of Generally Available Terms and Conditions ("SGAT") and will add similar language to CLEC contracts upon request.

BellSouth also has addressed this Commission's concerns about the terms available to CLECs when they combine UNEs for themselves, an issue raised in the South Carolina Order. BellSouth has demonstrated that it can, and does, provide collocation in a timely manner, consistent with industry standards. CLECs enjoy speedy collocation on state-approved terms and conditions with average installation intervals of less than 120 days. In addition to standard physical collocation, BellSouth offers "cageless" arrangements and virtual collocation, both of which may reduce CLECs' costs. BellSouth also makes available to CLECs that have requested collocation, information that will allow them to estimate the likely costs of various collocation arrangements they may desire.

Facilities-based carriers and resellers have a genuine opportunity to compete in Louisiana, as their success in winning almost 48,300 wired lines attests. This represents a more than 700 percent increase since the fall of 1997, when BellSouth filed its first section 271 application for Louisiana. Six carriers operate competing wireline networks that serve, at the

very least, approximately 4300 local lines. Facilities-based wireless carriers are serving approximately another 35,000 business and residential customers utilizing PCS spectrum. Resellers of BellSouth's retail telecommunications services in Louisiana include the six carriers that supplement facilities-based local service with resale offerings, and another 25 companies that are entering the local market exclusively through resale.

Based upon the activities of competing providers of wireline local service, BellSouth is eligible to file this application under Track A, 47 U.S.C. § 271(c)(1)(A). Wireline carriers collectively offer predominantly facilities-based local service to business and residential customers in Louisiana. In addition, PCS providers are offering telephone exchange service that is, for many business and residential consumers, an "actual commercial alternative" to BellSouth's local wireline service. Louisiana Order, 13 FCC Rcd at 6290, ¶ 73.

The public benefits of granting this Application are crystal clear. Ordinary callers in the United States are losing over \$100 million every week that the FCC delays section 271 relief — a price tag that should weigh heavily on this Commission. BellSouth has committed to setting its basic interLATA rates at least five percent below those of AT&T immediately upon entering the market. This discount (and ensuing competitive marketing by all carriers) would guarantee residential callers in Louisiana, who are most in need of price relief, the opportunity to realize savings from a long distance carrier they know and can trust. By 2006, fuller competition as a result of in-region, interLATA relief will create over 7600 new jobs in Louisiana and increase the gross state product by more than \$922 million.

BellSouth's entry into interLATA services will ignite competition in Louisiana's local markets as well, as the Louisiana PSC has found. The major long distance carriers will have to become serious about serving residential customers in the State, or risk losing long distance

profits when BellSouth offers packages of local and interLATA services. After interLATA relief is granted, moreover, the Big Three — AT&T, MCI, and Sprint — will be freed of all statutory restrictions on their own bundled service packages, which will add an additional dimension to local competition.

The traditional justification for excluding Bell operating companies (“BOCs”) from interLATA services has been that they might dominate interexchange markets through cost misallocation or discrimination. Yet the 1996 Act, federal and state regulations, and market realities all render such misconduct impossible. If BellSouth attempted to subsidize long distance service with local earnings, it would simply hasten competitors’ entry into the open local market. In the long distance market, BellSouth will start with zero market share in a business dominated by entrenched incumbents with vast resources and high sunk costs, factors that make successful predation unimaginable. And, as the Commission has found and historical experience confirms, regulators are well able to protect ratepayers when incumbent local exchange carriers enter markets adjacent to the local exchange — including the interLATA market.

More than six months ago, this Commission stated that it was “encouraged” by BellSouth’s “progress” toward opening its local markets to competitors, but concluded that additional steps were required to complete the job. South Carolina Order, 13 FCC Rcd at 554, ¶ 28. BellSouth has taken those steps and addressed the concerns of this Commission, as well as the legitimate concerns of competitors. Local markets in Louisiana are irreversibly open, as BellSouth’s competitors’ success in using every mode of entry contemplated by Congress and this Commission confirms. The time has come to allow Louisiana consumers to receive the full benefits of complete competition in all telecommunications markets.
