I have been put under a hardship, because of the SHVA act. I sell satellite dishes and I am told by both the dish networks and Direct T. V. that I am not able to get networks for my zip code # 76825. I assure you, you cannot get anything off rabbit ears. The nearest city is San Angelo which is 80 miles away. You can pick up 1 CBS station from San Angelo with a 30 ft. antenna.

Brady's local cable company provides all 4 networks on their cable system. My question to you is, why can the cable show networks and my satellite dish can't?

Lets cut off the networks from our cable system like you have on our satellite system and you'll have plenty of mad people. Without the ability to provide networks for 76825 my sales have stopped. Please help me if you can. I would appreciate a call or letter from you on this matter.
