Dear Chairman Kennard:

I would like to express my opposition to any action that could cause C-SPAN to be squeezed off of my cable line-up. To be more specific, "digital must-carry" rules, if they cause cable operators to stop carrying C-SPAN, will seriously limit my ability as an educator to access unfiltered information about the operations of our government.

In addition, I would oppose any action that would give TCI any further excuse for failing to expand their cable offerings in my area. TCI, a de facto monopoly in Western Washington state, has promised for years to expand their basic cable offerings on their South King County system to include some of the channels most other cable customers take for granted, such as C-SPAN 2, The Learning Channel, The History Channel, among others. They have come up with a hokey list of digitally compressed channels--for an extra fee, of course, and requiring the rental of a converter box. They show no signs of expanding their basic cable line-up as they have promised.
