KM is a party to settlement agreements and joint requests for approval of such settlement agreements on file with the Commission which, if approved, would result in: (i) the grant of KM's application for Channel 14 at Boise and the dismissal of all competing applications; (ii) the dismissal of KM's application for Channel 20 at Salt Lake City and the grant of a competing application; (iii) the dismissal of KM's application for Channel 38 at Greenville and the grant of a competing application, as amended to substitute a new entity as applicant, in which KM and each of the other competing applicants have equal equity and controlling interests; and (iv) the amendment of KM's application for Channel 11 at Holbrook to substitute a new entity as applicant, in which KM and each of the other competing applicants have equal equity and controlling interests, the grant of the amended KM application and the dismissal of all competing applications.

By letter dated October 7, 1996, the Commission returned KM's application for Channel 54 at Omaha, Nebraska, as unacceptable for filing; on November 6, 1996 KM timely filed and has pending a petition for reconsideration of the dismissal, seeking to have the Omaha application reinstated. On July 22, 1996, KM voluntarily requested that the Commission dismiss its application for a new full service television station on Channel 39 at Newton, Iowa (File No. BPCT-9604058L), and the Commission dismissed that application on August 20, 1996. The following KM applications for new full service television stations have been dismissed as part of universal settlements: (i) Channel 51 at Batavia, New York (File No. BPCT-951108KE), dismissed May 10, 1996; (ii) Channel 11 at Pendleton, Oregon (File No. BPCT-941021KV), dismissed on February 20, 1997; (iii) Channel 36 at Hutchinson, Kansas (File No. BPCT-950824KK), dismissed on April 2, 1997; and (iv) Channel 56 at Syracuse, New York (File No. BPCT-941021KW), dismissed on April 21, 1997.

Myoung Hwa Bae ("Mrs. Bae"), who is the President, Treasurer, a Director and the 100% shareholder of KM, holds 50% of the membership interests in OKC-30 Television, L.L.C., an Oklahoma limited liability company ("OKC-30"). OKC-30 is the permittee for new full-service commercial television station KAQS(TV), NTSC Channel 30, Shawnee, Oklahoma (File No. BPCT-950814KE), for which DTV Channel 29 has been allotted and issued. The construction permit was granted to OKC-30 as part of a universal settlement agreement, the approval of which also included the dismissal of a pending KM application for Channel 30 at Shawnee (File No. BPCT-950331KE) on July 30, 1996. KM filed a petition for reconsideration of the dismissal of its application on August 29, 1996, but subsequently requested that the Commission dismiss the petition. Mrs. Bae also holds 100% of the membership interests and is an officer and the manager of Sierra Television LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Sierra"). Sierra is the permittee for new full service commercial television station KAUC(TV), NTSC Channel 58, Sierra Vista, Arizona (File No. BPCT-941021KI), for which DTV Channel 44 has been allotted and issued.

Proposed Program Service

The applicant, KM Communications, Inc. ("KM"), proposes to use various methods and resources to stay abreast of the needs and interests of Parkersburg, Iowa, and the service area of the proposed station. KM proposes to broadcast a mix of entertainment, information and public affairs programming that is responsive to those ascertained needs and interests, including programming designed to serve the children in its audience, and would ensure that such programming is representative of all significant sides of a given issue. The proposed station would be operated in compliance with applicable provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Commission Rules and policies, including but not limited to such provisions, rules and policies related to political broadcasting.
